WorldCat Local is more than the world's largest catalogue of books. It's the single search that connects people to all of your materials—physical, electronic and digital—and to the delivery services that get them what they need. These include resources from 40 national catalogues and partners like Google Books, HathiTrust, JSTOR and OAlster®.

One search is all it takes

With WorldCat® Local, you give your users access to a single search box that eliminates the need to consult separate resources and interfaces. They will have instant access to your library's materials—digital objects, electronic materials, databases, e-journals, music, videos, audio, e-books, maps, journals, theses and print. Plus, they'll see what's available in group and consortial catalogues, as well as in all other WorldCat® libraries.

Connect users with the items they need

Only the most appropriate “get it” options are presented, so users quickly **connect with the items they need**. And because WorldCat Local integrates with your existing delivery services, users know immediately whether an item is available and how to get it. One click lets an authorised user view an electronic copy, place a hold or initiate a resource sharing request.

Provide users with the tools to evaluate

Helping your users to distinguish between materials is a vital function of the library. WorldCat Local is working with multiple partners to display content in the detailed records of items to help users evaluate. Forty million enrichments, including jacket images, descriptions, reviews and tables of contents have been added at no additional charge.

Give users unique insight into a body of work

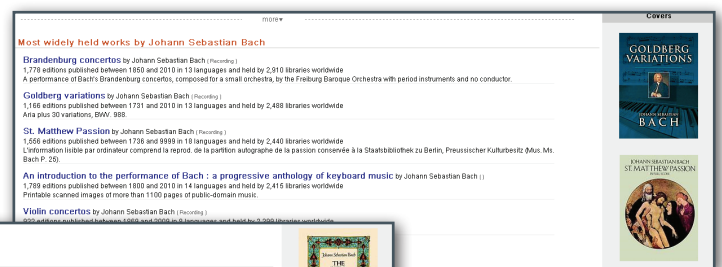

But OCLC has developed this new insight through WorldCat® Identities. Library users can gain a firm understanding of an individual's intellectual contribution to a discipline or genre, and discover links to other relevant materials that can form the basis for further study. Analysis of data in WorldCat makes this possible.

With WorldCat Local, your library gains Web visibility through OCLC's partnerships with leading search engines (Google, Yahoo!), services such as Google Books, social networking services like Facebook, and other popular sites.

Find materials quickly and easily

With WorldCat Local, simplicity doesn't stop with the search. Your users are presented with only the most appropriate options to quickly connect them with what they need.

Users also have direct access to electronic resources from search results, due to integration with the WorldCat knowledge base. A 'View Now' link on brief records connects users directly to the electronic articles and open-access content that their searches retrieve.

And because WorldCat Local integrates with your current services and live circulation data, users know immediately if (and where) an item is available.

One click lets users view an electronic copy or place a hold or resource sharing request. They can identify the branch or department location of the items they want, and they don't need to check multiple Web pages for electronic resources, group/consortial catalogues and interlibrary loan options.

Connect users on the Web

Because WorldCat Local offers the same feature set as WorldCat.org—a site built to reflect the same experience as other popular Web sites—your users will instantly feel at home with the look and feel of the interface. We include relevancy ranking of search results, results sets that bring multiple versions of a work together under one record, faceted browsing capability, citation formatting options and cover art.

In addition, a wide array of social networking tools let users share opinions and expertise with online peers. They can create lists of favourite topics (excellent for study groups and class requirements), write reviews, make recommendations and create personal profiles, just as they do on other popular social networking sites like Facebook and Twitter.

A closer look:

'View Now' link streamlines access

WorldCat Local offers a 'View Now' link in search results. When you click the link, it opens a box with a 'View full text' link that takes you directly to open-access content and electronic articles that are available for the resource selected from the search results.
