Reminder: Letters of recommendation MUST be sent separately via email from the recommender's email account (applicants may NOT submit the letters). All letters of recommendation MUST be received by February 28, 2010; letters received after February 28, 2010 will not be considered.

Eligible referees include colleagues, advisers, supervisors and other professionals who are familiar with you and your work, and who can evaluate your ability to participate in the Fellowship Program. Family members or relatives are not eligible to write letters of recommendation. Recommenders should state how long they have known the applicant and in what capacity, provide evidence of the applicant's commitment to professional development and service, and give an assessment of the candidate's promise as a developing professional.
