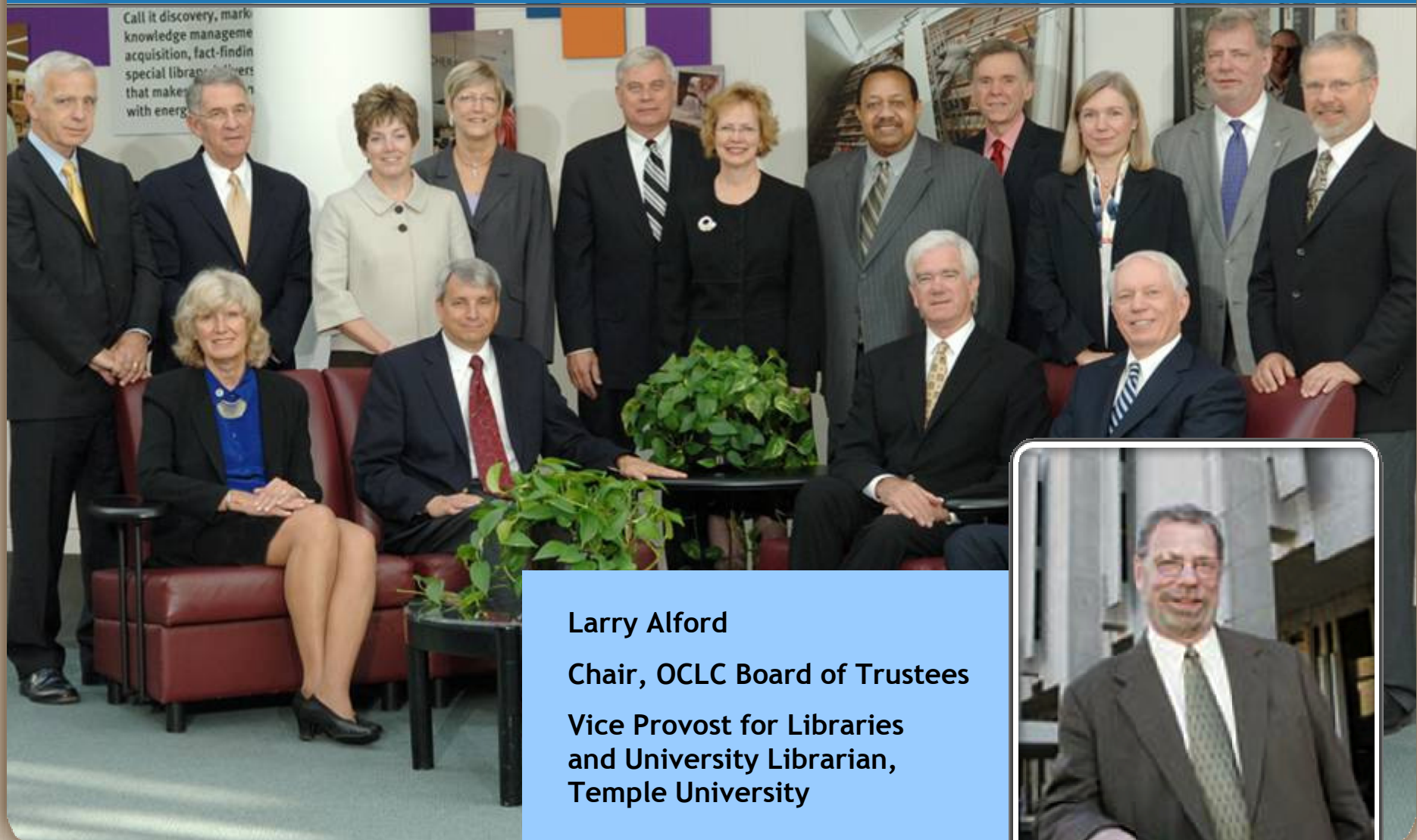

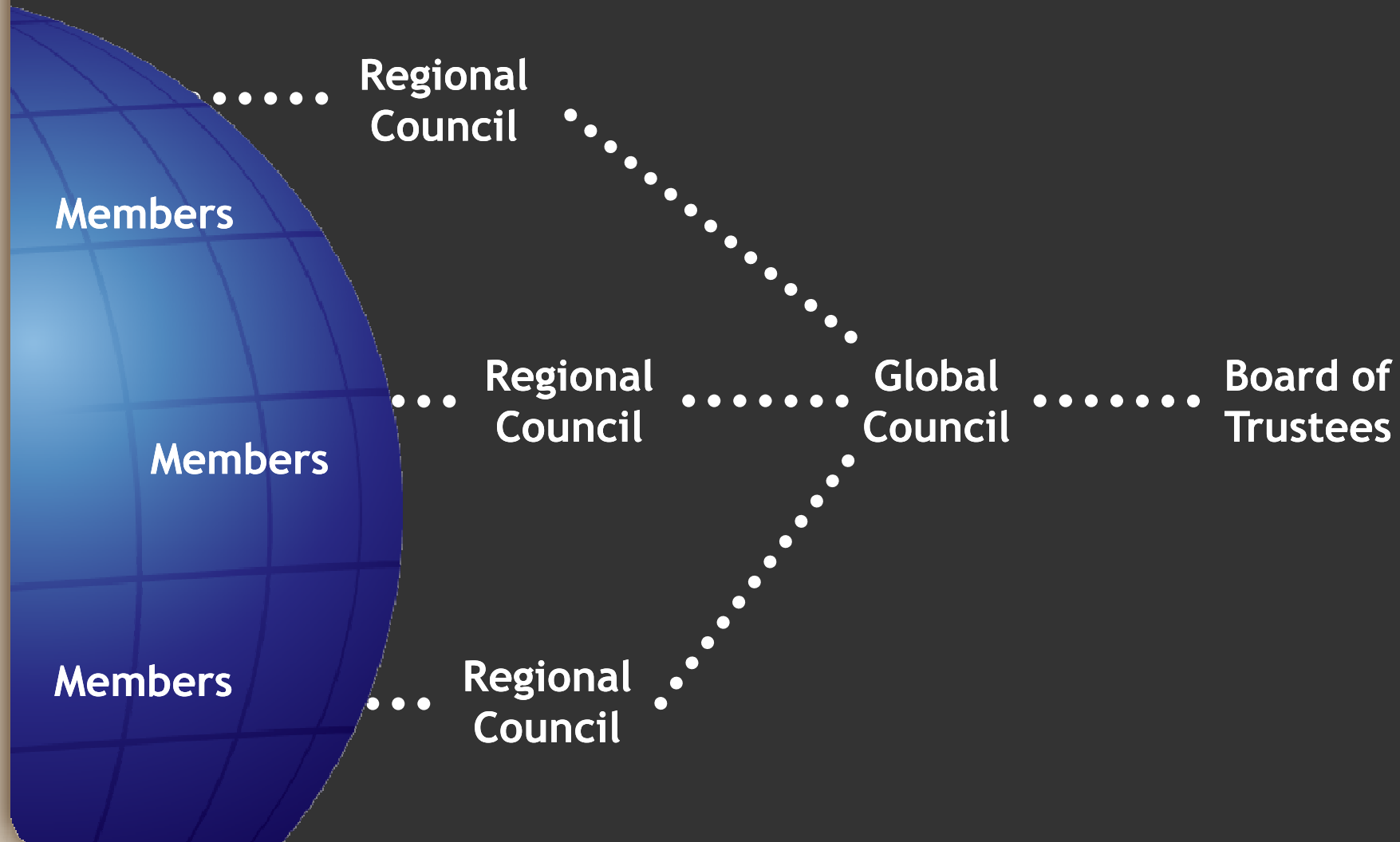

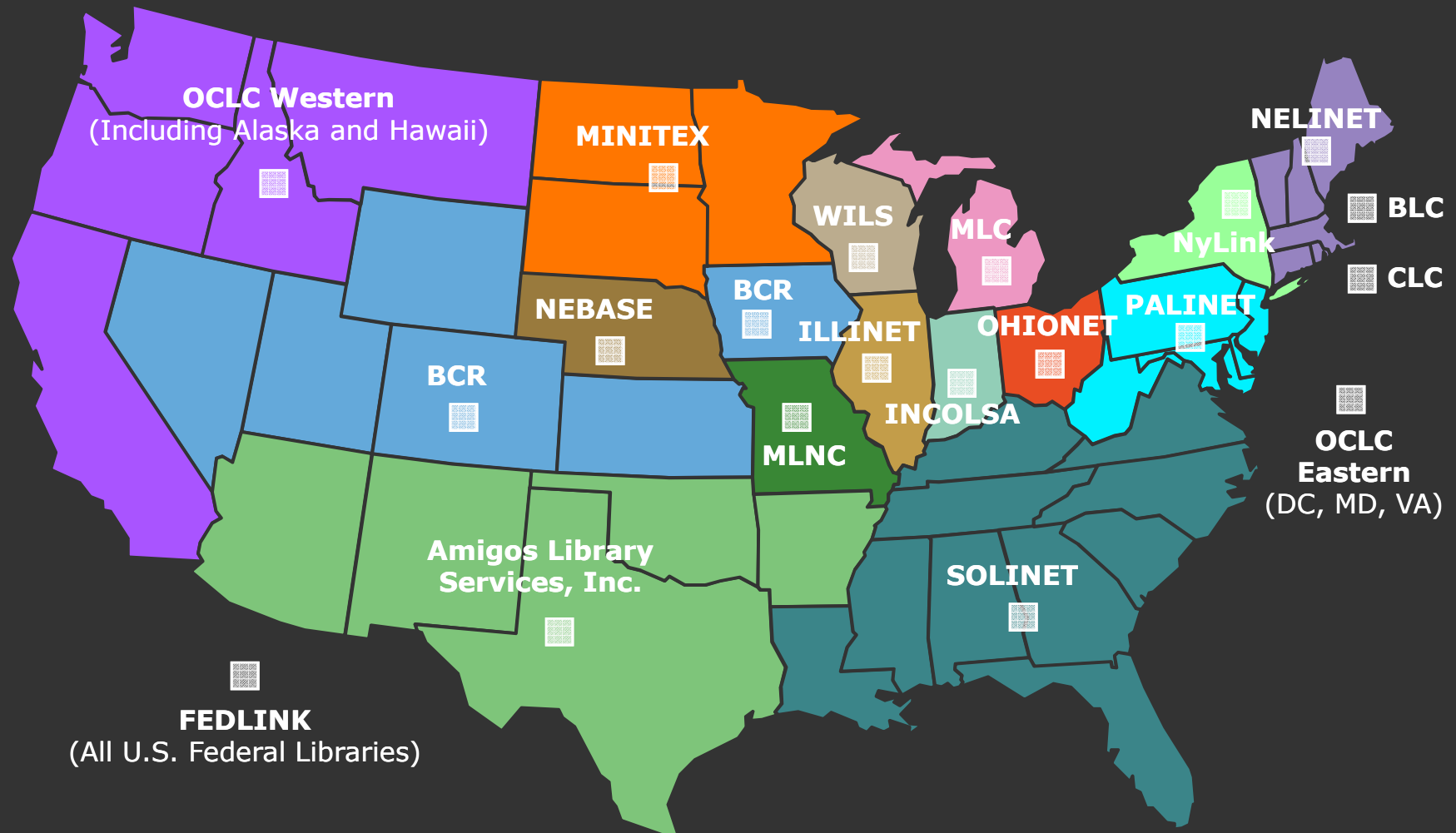

Employees can participate immediately in the Thrift Plan by contributing up to 25% of their monthly compensation on a pretax or after-tax basis.

The company matches each employee's contribution on the first 6% of the annual base compensation at a rate of 35%, which vests at a rate of 20% for each year of service and is fully vested after five years. After two years of service, employees are automatically enrolled in the OCLC retirement plan. Every month, OCLC contributes 7.15% of the employee's base salary to the plan. # Caskets found as workers demolish mausoleum

**'We had no idea anyone was buried there.'**

*Mausoleum being leveled*

When men a majestic granite mausoleum sat on a prominent site in Madison's Tremont section, a recently related tale gave it that remained Friday.

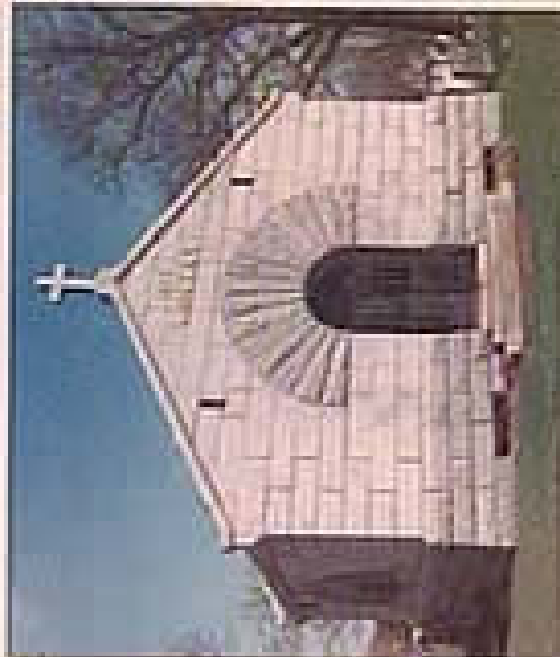
Once completed the Green King of the mausoleum built by Mrs. Henry railroad magnate Harvey Lantry and named for more than 40 years.

But it was that new burst of earth and four caskets that presently belong to members of Lantry's family, perhaps to Lantry himself.

Discovery of the caskets this week was just one more chapter of a bizarre story.

"We had no idea anyone was buried there," explained Thomas Lantry, director of construction for the Madison Catholic Diocese.

"We have there were six caskets in the mausoleum. But we had moved all six and they were empty," he said. "But when we removed what we thought was the foundation slab for the caskets, we found another six caskets, buried under 2 feet of concrete."



The Lantry mausoleum, awaiting removal, it left a mystery behind.

The graves — no one yet knew who is in them — were covered with concrete vault covers and then covered with earth. Lantry said. And from the top corner, the graves were left to place.

The mausoleum was found buried because it had become dry ground, Lantry said.

"It had an interior marble walling and marble walls and, because of settling and thawing, they had fallen to the floor — but there was still debris hanging from the ceiling. The building was falling apart and it was dangerous."

And Lantry, although he obviously was a man of means, left no

money for maintenance, he said. Indeed, he told us pointed that only one was buried in his mausoleum.

One of Lantry's relatives, Louis Lantry Griffin, said Harvey Lantry was a close relative who was born in New York and later moved to Florida and then.

He was a successful capitalist for several years on the Mississippi River and began work in railroad construction in the 1880s.

In 1877 he moved to Kansas, bought a limestone quarry and built stone bridge abutments for a railroad. Lantry and Lantry was the richest man in Kansas at the time of his death.

According to Griffin, "Harvey died at Spring City, Kansas, but he was buried in Madison. After the death of his father, his mother married to Madison along with her children. Because she had such a hard life, Harvey moved when he was young that he would take good care of her. He did."

Now his mausoleum is gone and his grave, for the moment, is marked. Griffin said he has not decided what to do to mark the grave.

The mausoleum had the same "Lantry" carved over its door arch. Griffin said, he "will never likely have that stone slab placed on a concrete base at the site."

# DOE to do NEPA's EIS on BNFL's AMWTP at INEEL after SRA protest

## *Nuclear waste incinerator to get full environmental study*

A nuclear waste incinerator costing an estimated \$1.8 billion scheduled to be built at the Idaho National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory (INEEL) near Arco will have a full environmental impact statement (EIS) conducted after all.

The EIS is required under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), but until last month the Department of Energy (DOE)

technologies BNFL has chosen to incinerate and otherwise treat mixed waste. We still don't know exactly what waste will be treated. Nor will we learn the answers to these and other fundamental questions if DOE-ID pursues its intended course of action, for a supplemental analysis does not require the full public involvement that is the cornerstone of NEPA. And, I would argue, of any broad acceptance of mixed waste incineration here in Idaho."

DOE, the American Nuclear

shall execute a procurement contract for the Facility by June 1, 1997, complete construction of the Facility by December 31, 2002, and commence operation of the Facility by March 31, 2003."

Before the governor's agreement was signed, federal law within the Resource and Conservation Recovery Act (RCRA) obligated the DOE to clean up its nuclear waste. Putting the AMWTP in Idaho is part of the DOE's efforts to consolidate its nuclear

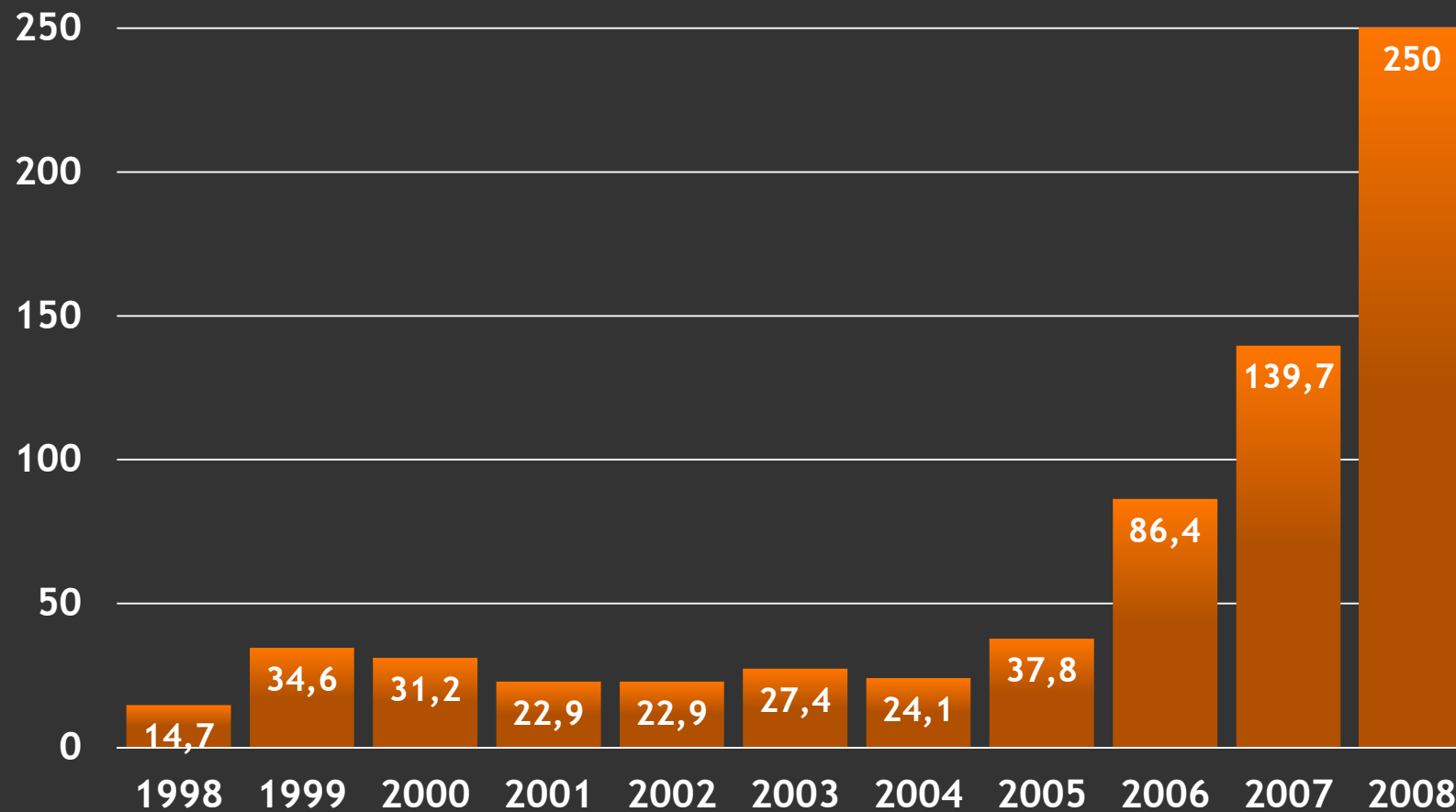

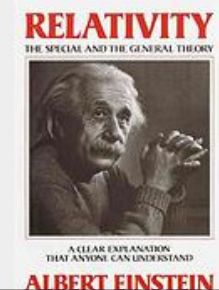
