

New and Changed Entries August 2008

The following selected new and changed entries are effective on August 1. We expanded and revised four areas of the Tables and Schedules: (1) the Table 5 Ethnic and National Groups provisions for peoples who speak, or whose ancestors spoke, Malayo-Polynesian languages of Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, Brunei, East Timor; (2) the related Table 6 Languages provisions; (3) the related 499 and 899 schedule entries; and (4) the various types of gymnastics in 796.44 and 796.47 and the related 613.71 schedule entry.

Individual changes to records are not indicated in Tables 5 and 6. Changes to schedule numbers are indicated only by underlining. Other schedule changes are underlined, and deletions are marked by strikethroughs. Schedule entries without underlining or strikethroughs are old entries that are included for context.
