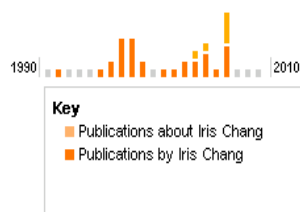

 In December 1937, in the capital of China, one of the most brutal massacres in the annals of wartime barbarity occurred. The Japanese army swept into the city of Nanking and within weeks not only looted and burned the city but systematically raped, tortured and murdered more than 300,000 Chinese civilians. The story is told from 3 perspectives: that of the Japanese soldiers who performed it; of the Chinese civilians who endured it; and finally of a group of Europeans and Americans who refused to abandon the city and were able to create a safety zone that saved almost 300,000 Chinese.

Antonio Maria Osio papers, 1823-1853 by Antonio Maria Osio ()

Letters and documents, many relating to land transactions and litigation concerning Angel Island and other property in California and Baja California. A few items pertain to Mariano Soberanes' attempt to obtain payment for provisions taken by José Castro's troops in 1846. Some papers concerning the settlement of Osio's estate, 1878-1885, also included.

Monterey presidio account books: mss., 1828, 1830 ()

Accounts for the soldiers at the presidio. C-E 47 (1 v.) contains accounts for 1830. C-E 51 (1 v.) contains accounts for 1828, with some entries signed by Mariano G. Vallejo, José de Jesús Pico, Simón Cota, José Joaquín de la Torre, and José Raymundo de la Torre. Three loose receipts from Antonio María Osio constitute the portfolio.

Reminiscences concerning life in Monterey and San Francisco; and comments on Kodiak Indians, the fur trade, Hippolyte Bouchard in Monterey, life and treatment of Indians, missions, early commerce and hide and tallow trade, the Russian American Company, early governors and revolts, his position as customs official at Monterey, the Padres-Hijar Colony, M. G. Vallejo's outpost in Sonoma, American intervention, the Bear Flag Revolt, etc.

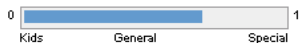

The collection consists of letters and documents (in Spanish and English) of Mariano Guadalupe Vallejo (1808-1890). The bulk of the materials in the collection cover the years 1844-1846, and there are about forty drafts of letters by Vallejo himself in the collection. Subject matter includes the defense of the northern frontier, relations with the missions, and the treatment of the Indians by Father Jesús María Vásquez del Mercado.
