Connexion client 3.0 enhancements

- A Welcome screen that quickly displays your cataloging authorization level and Support contact information as well as other user interface improvements
- Removal of the need to be a computer Administrator to run the software or macros, in line with current security and technology standards

- Better display of non-Latin scripts so you no longer have to download additional fonts
- Decommissioning of obsolete features, including GLIMIR and Institution Records, to reduce confusion
- Links to online Help documentation to ensure you're always seeing the most up-to-date resources
- Compatibility with Windows 10

- Help link revisions
- Default keymap "CTRL+A" removed from constant data application
- Bibliographic record leader and 008 field dropdown updates
- Additional obsolete features decommissioned
- Bug fixes

WHAT IS IT?

- Streamlined offering to help libraries update their holdings
- No additional charge for libraries with a cataloging subscription

WHAT WILL IT DO?

- Add holdings to records in WorldCat that match
- Remove inaccurate holdings
- Add new records where there is no match.

WHAT IS NOT INCLUDED?

WorldCat enrichment, high-touch data counseling, LHRs





Request a streamlined WorldCat holdings update project

Thank you for requesting an update of your library's WorldCat holdings to ensure the best possible access to your collections through OCLC services. This streamlined process will help you quickly update your WorldCat holdings to maximize your library's visibility on OCLC services such as Connexion, WorldShare Interlibrary Loan, FirstSearch, and WorldCat.org.

The streamlined process for updating your library's WorldCat holdings is provided at **no additional charge** with your library's OCLC cataloging subscription. When you send your library's complete MARC 21 catalog data to OCLC, the process matches your records with WorldCat and:

- Adds holdings to matching WorldCat records
- Removes inaccurate WorldCat holdings
- Adds new records when a matching record is not available (optional)

WorldCat knowledge base update

SO FAR THIS YEAR...

 3.5 million OCLC control numbers added to WorldCat knowledge base titles

NEXT STEPS

 OCLC will continue to assign control numbers to titles that currently lack them



Language of cataloging

WHAT IS IT?

 A Collection Manager setting to specify preferred language of cataloging for WorldCat knowledge base collections

WHY IS IT NEEDED?

- Libraries want records delivered cataloged in a specific language to meet their patrons' needs
- A library has a collection in a different language than their preferred language. Librarians can choose to receive records cataloged in that language.




Language of cataloging

HOW WILL IT WORK?

- If WorldCat records are available cataloged in the preferred language:
 - WorldCat holdings will be set on these records
 - MARC records will be delivered in that language
- If not available in the preferred language, the library can choose to set holdings on and receive the best-match record or no record
- If a record in the preferred language later becomes available, holdings will be set on the new record, and that record will be delivered




Institution Level Settings






Institution Level Settings



Encoding Level project

Project goal is to eliminate OCLC-defined codes

- Allow use of standard MARC 21 numeric encoding levels
- Convert existing alphabetic encoding levels within WorldCat
 - K-Level record conversion
 - I-Level record conversion
 - 6 million records converted
 - 34 million records left to convert
 - M-Level record conversion
- No longer allow the use of OCLC alphabetic encoding levels



Faceted Application for Subject Terminology

- Collaboration of OCLC Research and the Library of Congress
- Consists of nine distinct categories or facets:
 - Personal names (field 600)
 - Corporate names (field 610)
 - Meeting names (field 611)
 - Geographic names (field 651)
 - Events (field 647)
 - Titles (field 630)
 - Time periods (field 648)
 - Topics (field 650)
 - Form/Genre (field 655)



Heading enrichment

- Project goal:
 - Control all controllable headings
 - Update headings as applicable
 - Apply the heading enrichment
- Start date: 14 March 2022
 - As of 31 May 2022, processed 307 million records
 - Enriched 98.8 million records
 - 520 million records in WorldCat to be reviewed



Updating FAST headings

Adds, Changes, Deletes

- OCLC adds FAST to WorldCat bibliographic records with Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH) and no FAST headings. FAST headings may be manually assigned within a new record for a resource being cataloged, or to a record found in the database for the resource.
- When changing, deleting, and/or adding Library of Congress Subject Headings in a bibliographic record, while not required, it is encouraged to delete the entire set of FAST headings, and they will be completely regenerated in about a month


