Introduction

The Queer Metadata Collective is a group of cataloguers, librarians, archivists, scholars, museum and information professionals with a concerted interest in improving the description and classification of queer people in Galleries, Libraries, Archives, Museums, and Special Collections (GLAMS) and other information systems. The Collective's primary goal is to develop a set of best practices for the description, cataloging, and classification of queer information resources in GLAMS.

Current Status

The Queer Metadata Collective's work is underway. The initial call for participation attracted over 200 working group members and over 600 newsletter/peer review participants.

Currently, the QMDC has divided into 5 working groups:

- Ethical Framework/Document Structure WG Developing sections for future report (bibliography, history, context, best practices etc.)
- 2. **Classification WG** Developing policies, procedures, and best practices for the use and updating of classification procedures.
- Description WG Developing policies, procedures, and best practices for archival / museum / gallery description, labelling, etc.
- Subject Headings WG Developing policies, procedures, and best practices for the development, use, and updating of subject headings.
- 5. **Names, Naming, and Authorities WG** Developing policies and procedures for name/record authorities, naming policies.

Our future plans call involve the creation of Toolkit and Education groups which will operationalize the QMDC's recommendation.

- Practise respectful and reciprocal collaboration with communities when possible to avoid uncritical application of terms. Follow community protocols as part of this process.
- Prioritise using the terms the creators of the work use in subject descriptor fields, even if those terms aren't in controlled vocabularies

- public statements by the individual,
- correspondence,
- partner(s) at time of death,
- chosen family members,
- community members,
- children (adopted or biological),
- and, if all other options are exhausted, family of origin.



Be explicit about queerphobia in collections, items & metadata.

- Include a contextualising statement and/or content warning for sensitive language that is self-ascribed or directly in the material itself, either before the user encounters it, or in each place encountered
- Identify WEB3CH2A2MS subjects in catalogues and descriptions where possible. Add local subdivisions for "--Heterosexual" "--Man" "--Able-Bodied" "—Allosexual."
- When describing harassment, harm, violence: perpetrators and victims should be identified with the active voice and responsibility embedded within metadata.

- Collaborate with the specifically-impacted community and be aware that individuals within that community may have different terminology.
- Different cultures and languages understand and classify genders and sexuality which may not translate into the dominant culture or languages
- Include terms in the original language (original script and transliterated) alongside added translations and descriptions.



Give preference to alternative systems and practices that prioritise local control and authority when possible.

 Interrogate conflicting needs in knowledge creation and discovery.





Give preference to alternative systems and practices that prioritise local control and authority when possible.

- Interrogate conflicting needs in knowledge creation and discovery.
- Make a variant heading the authorised heading; Use non-LCSH controlled vocabularies and ontologies; Create local Cutter numbers, subject guides, or collection tags for orientations, identities, or topics not represented—all of these are better than collocating by classification.

- Plan proactively for periodic assessment and remediation.
- Avoid using machine learning, "Al", or automation for batch replacement of terms. Only use them as a tool to aid assessment, alongside qualitative analysis around the rationale and impact of existing description.





If you are queer, trust in your own authority, knowledge, community warrant, and your "queer cataloguer's judgement."

- If relevant to the resource, feel comfortable assigning headings for historical identity labels that are no longer commonly used such as "Invert."
- If you are not queer: avoid applying queer terminology or classification to a resource if the resource has nothing to do with queerness. Don't apply queer terminology to authority files if they are not relevant.

- Most LCSH Search is more precise for more specific terms
- Most EDS terms are more precise for more general terms
- With exceptions, EDS is more precise for all terms whether more or less specific


Mothman Properties: Research Opportunities

Does this mean we throw out legacy metadata in favor of linked data? No!

- Legacy metadata can always be linked into an ontology later
- It can serve as "breadcrumbs" in a methodology like the one described to test whether an algorithm is retrieving what you want it to, or results that are topical and unbiased
- If it provides source information like the 670 field of a NACO record, it could be used as a check on hallucinating AI
- Maybe precision is increased not by the linked data relationships themselves but the attributes
 accessible through those relationships

Metadata continues to underwrite search that is precise, transparent, and authoritative.
