

GreenGlass "Collections Snapshots"

- What are the historic strengths or highlights of the collection?
- How does the collection support current teaching and research?
- What is the focus of current collecting activities? (Eg. topics, periods, movements, etc.).
- How does the collection relate to particular classes, and to faculty research?
- How does the collection support interdisciplinary research?
- What formats for books, journals, etc. do your faculty and students prefer?




Parsing and Assessing

- Tableau for deeper analysis
- Defining collection development action steps

Librarian Liaison Engagement

"Having reliable data that demonstrated the overwhelming bias of the collection towards classic French literature helped me to identify the now obvious gaps in the collection. As a result of the assessment, I was able to formulate a selection plan that emphasized modern and contemporary francophone authors, and allowed me to track progress towards increasing the diversity of the collection. It also allowed me the opportunity to integrate many automated criteria into a French language approval plan."

Keys to Successful GreenGlass Integration

- Reusable Queries and Analysis: French analysis project = a template for collections review in other language areas
- Measurable Progress: track progress toward collection goals
- Next Steps: address fears about deaccessioning and weeding even as positive outcomes in collection development are obtained




GreenGlass at the UR part 2: EAST!

GreenGlass for EAST - Cohort 1



Emergency-Disaster Planning



Priority 1

Impossible to Replace

- · Unique materials: manuscripts and archival records
- · Irreplaceable items: rare books

Priority 2

Expensive to Repair or Replace

- High or significant research value that are expensive to repair or replace
- Volumes with significant research value that need special treatment if damaged (books printed with clay-coated paper)
- · Microfilm masters

Priority 3

Materials on loan from Other Libraries

Priority 4

General Collection Priorities: may be replaced with other copies or format, but rank according to research value, then monetary value

- · Liaison identified ranges and/or volumes or sets
- · Heavily requested volumes
- Microfilm

Priority 5

Expendable

- Duplicate/secondary copies
- · Replaceable with other formats (ebook, databases, etc.)
- · Not essential to mission of library/college

Priority 1

- All items in Rare locations (97 items total)
- All Music (Class M): 6 items
- All Modern Languages & Literatures (Subclasses PC-PD; PF-PG; PL, PQ, PT): 91 items

Priority 2

- Some items in the ACA collection (370 items total see attached Excel file)
- Most Music (Class M): 27 items
- About half of the French language and literature items (Subclasses PC, PQ; call number range: PC2068 – 3680; PQ139 – 3939)
- A few Music items (subclass ML) in the Reference collection (40 items total):
 - o The New Grove Dictionary of Music and Musicians (29 volumes)
 - o The New Grove Dictionary of American Music (4 volumes)
 - o The New Grove Dictionary of Jazz (3 volumes)
 - o The New Grove Dictionary of Opera (4 volumes)

Priority 3

• All French literature items in the General collection (call number range PQ1 – 3999): about 2,900 items

Priority 4

Everything else (with the Krantz CD collection salvaged last).

- Assessing Special Collections;
- Identifying scarce materials in general collections; and
- Complementing projects from weeding to emergency and disaster planning.



60+ academic & research libraries from Maine to Florida

9.2 million monographs and over 5K serials/journals titles committed to retention





The EAST experience of working with GreenGlass™ for monograph retention spoiled us.





EAST contracted with CRL to:

- Validate, normalize and compare holdings & item records across libraries
- Provide a suite of Excel spreadsheet reports to EAST for review
- Based on EAST's development of a retention model, facilitate retention allocations across the participating libraries


Sample CRL report



From spreadsheets to data visualization

- Our experience of working with Tableau convinced us it could supplement CRL's work by providing data visualization and real-time data analysis tools
- Provides high level data on the collection serials and journals collections of EAST
- Allows us to focus on groups of titles held by different numbers of EAST member libraries
- Once we have agreed upon a retention model, Tableau simplifies the process of review of title lists by libraries





Challenges

- Most serials/journals projects have focused on specific publishers or subjects where this type of analysis is not required
- Serials collection analysis is HARD
- Still new for CRL so setting expectations and ongoing communication have been critical
- Dirty data can be intimidating for the libraries
- Libraries focus is more on withdrawals than on retention



Lessons Learned

- Allow adequate time in the project plan for data review

 multiple titles cataloged on one record,
 preceding/succeeding titles cause challenges,
 electronic/microgram cataloged on print record....
- Stay focused on the mission, but be flexible
- Acknowledge that withdrawal is a major goal
- CRL is a good partner for this work but using Tableau was critical to facilitate analysis at scale
- Go for it!
