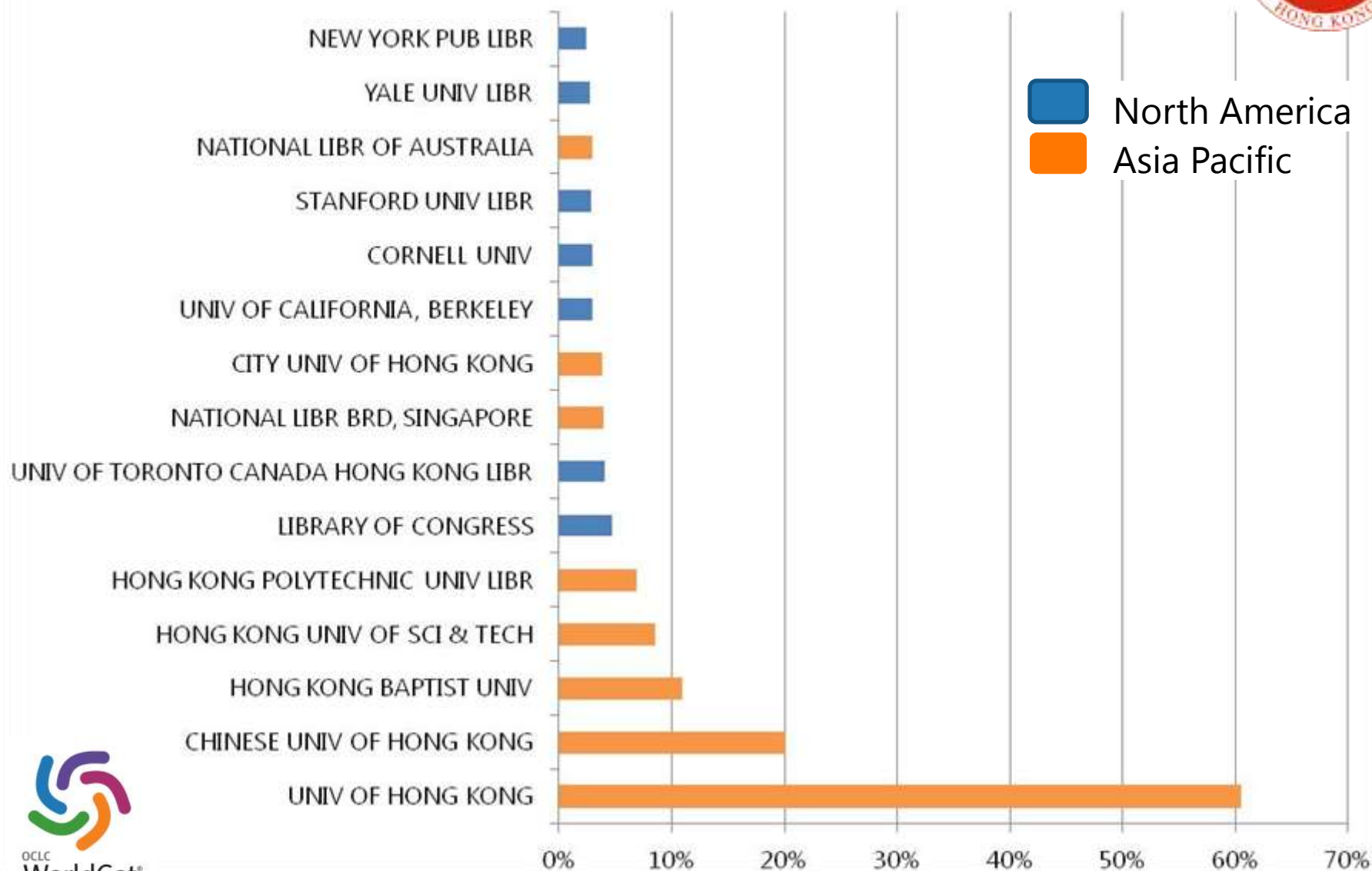

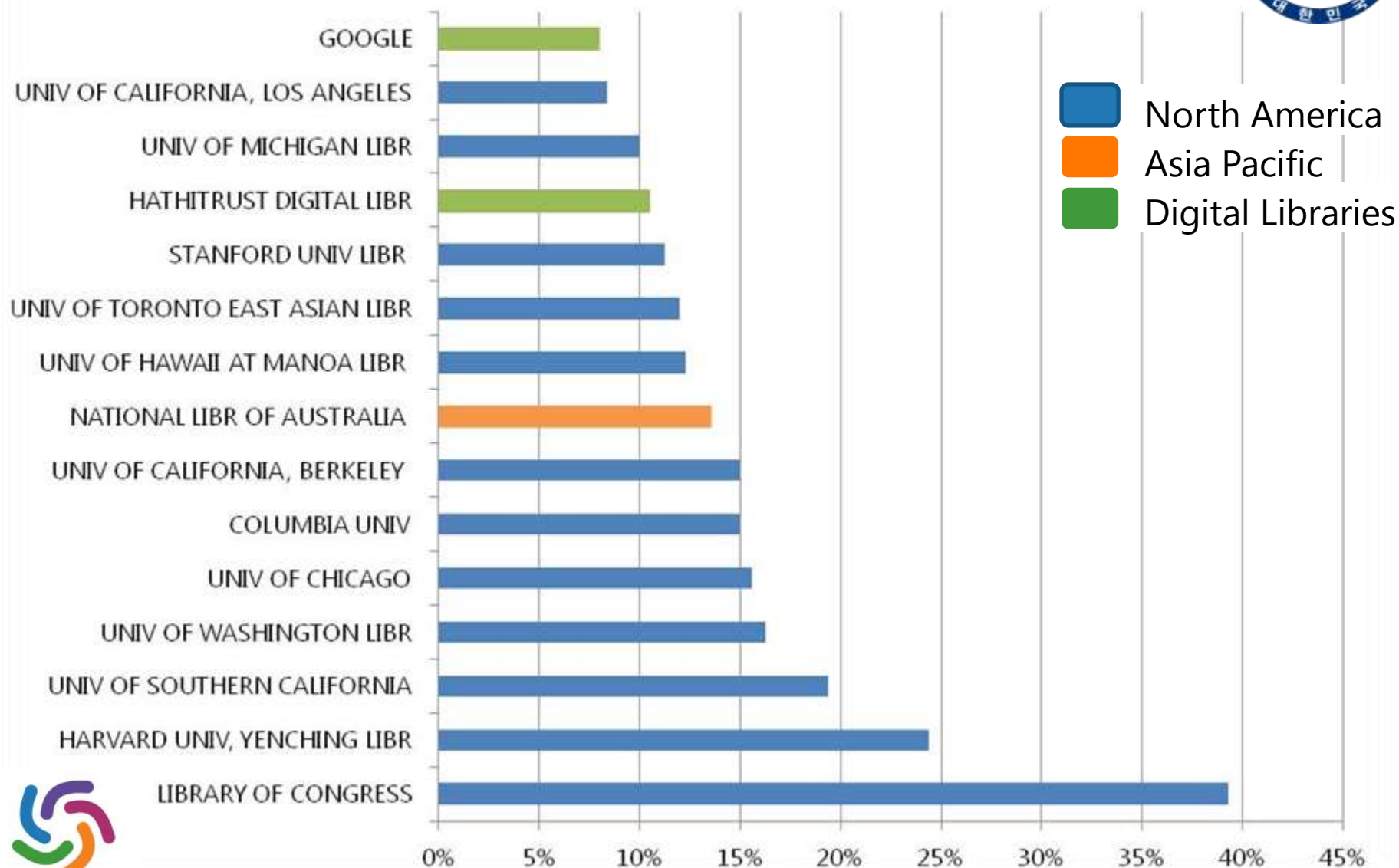
Library Coverage of Works Related to Hong Kong

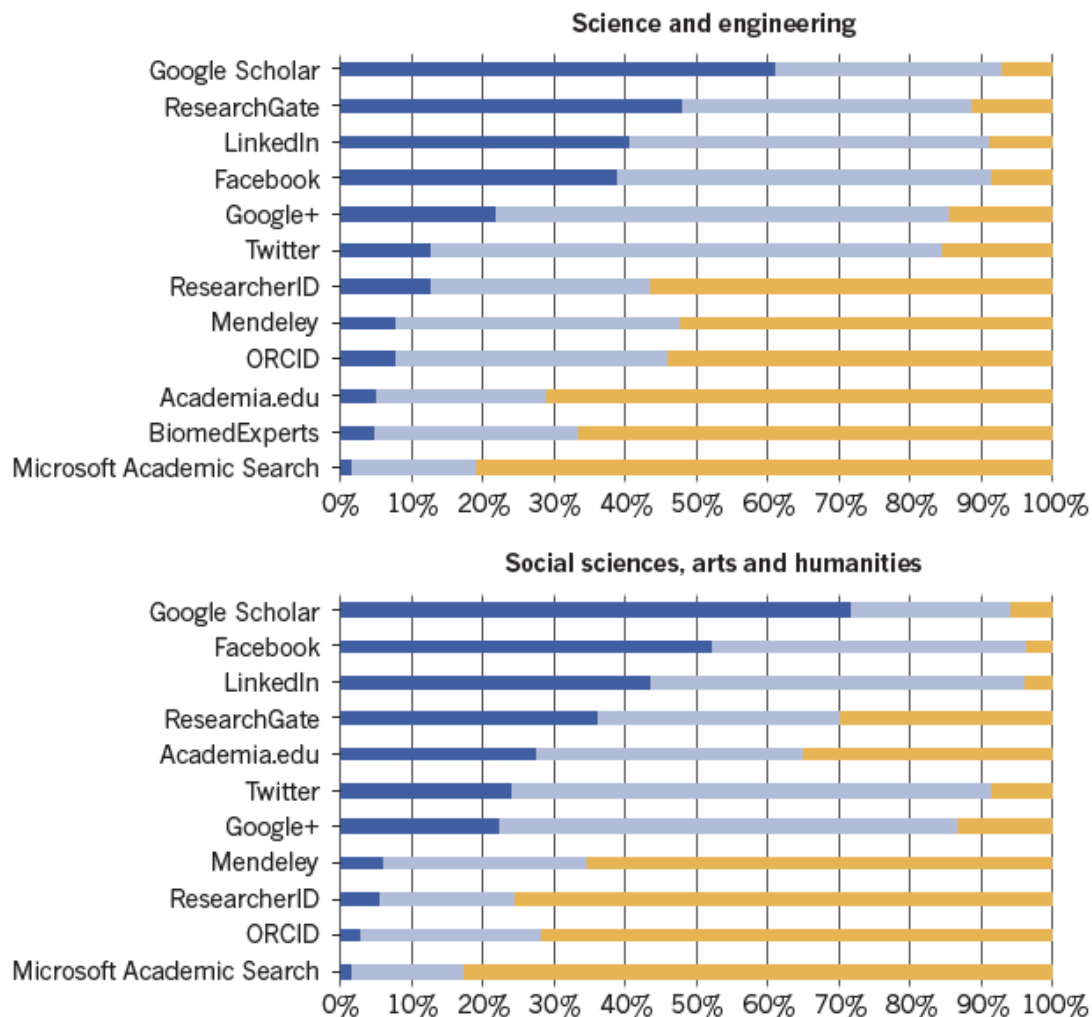

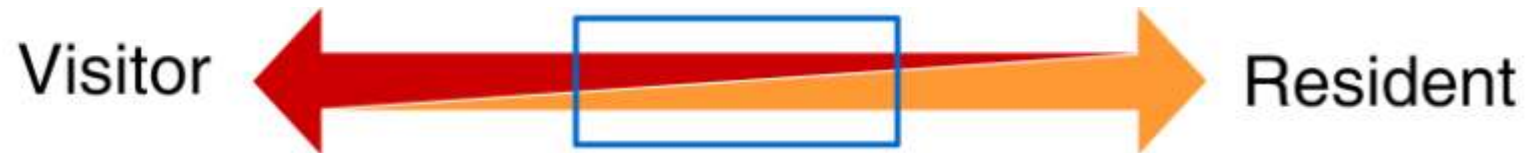

Institution: opportunity costs

- Growing misalignment between level of **investment** in print collections and their use within changing practices of research and learning
- Reconfigure space around **engagement** rather than around collections
- Stewardship and **efficient access** remain important.

Systemwide: balance contributions

- **Manage down** institutional collections
- **Collectively** manage regional, national collections based on existing/emerging infrastructure
- Recognize bbbbbb **different obligations** – different levels of ‘responsibility’ to print record
- Recognize **distinctive** contributions.

Shared print- collective collection

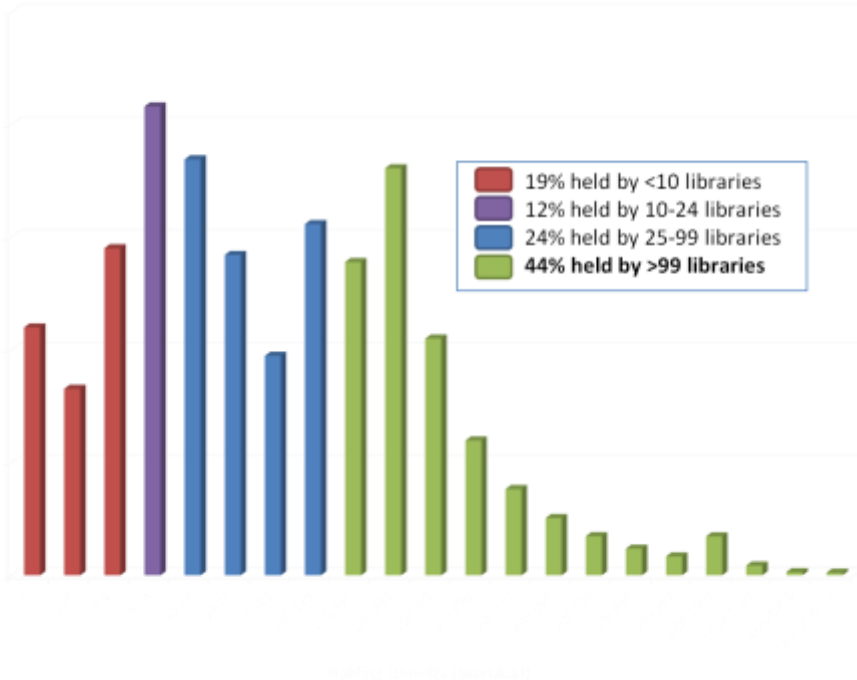
Then: Value relates to depth and breadth of local collection.

Now: Value relates to systemwide curation of and access to print collections – ‘rightscaling’.

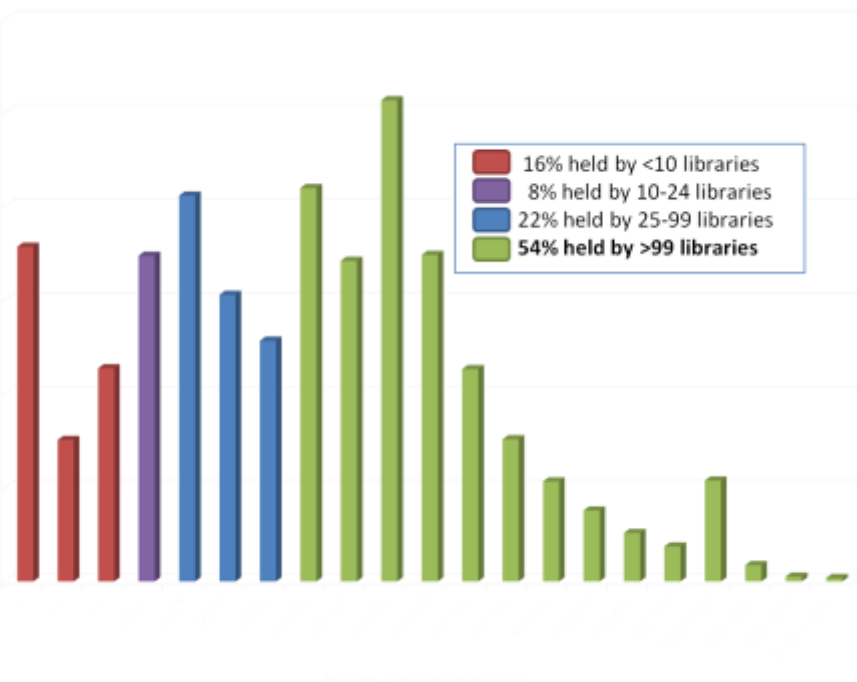


Decision support through shared data.

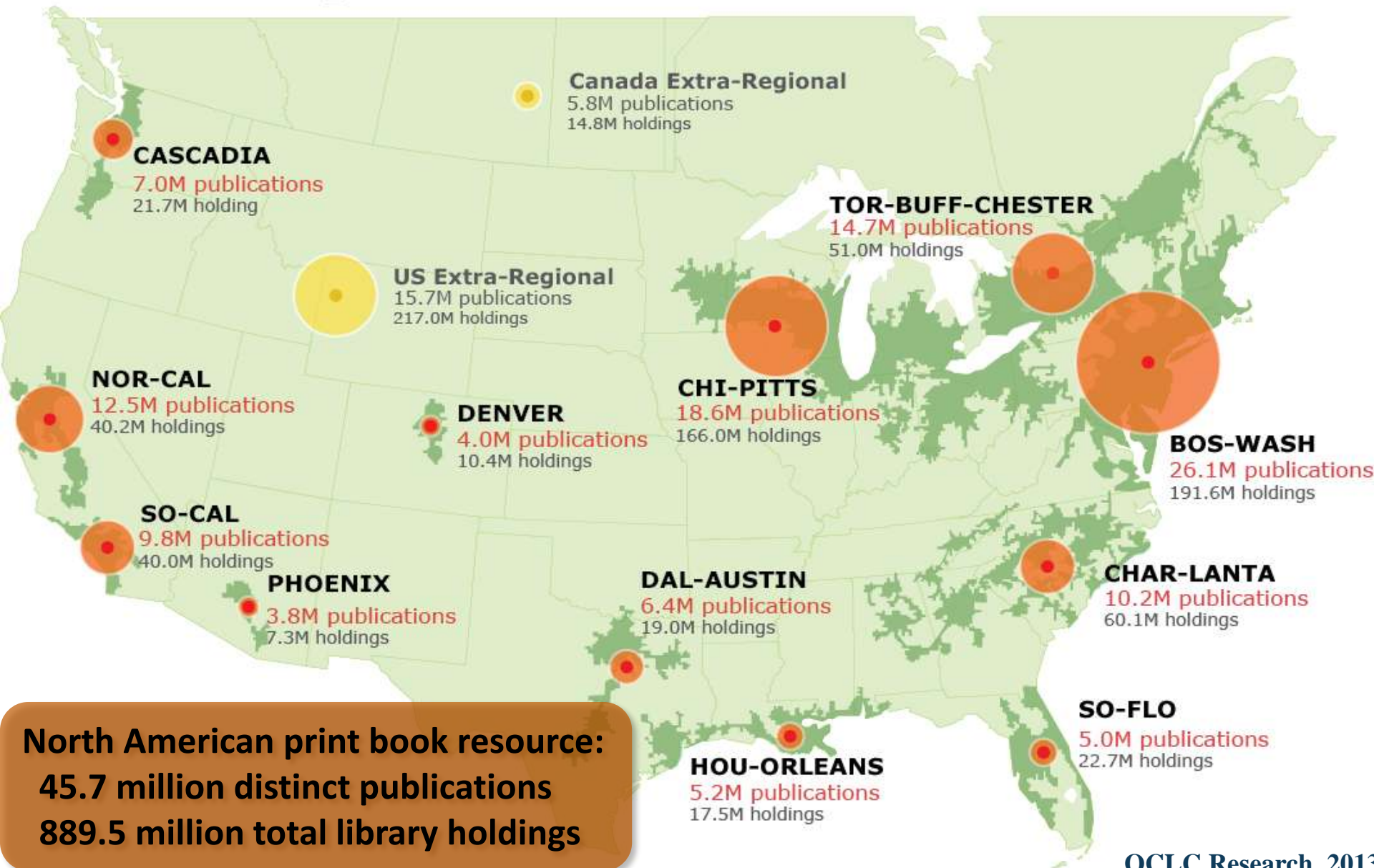
WorldCat Holdings Distribution for Titles Held by the University of Melbourne Library (UMV) - March 2013

Regional Print Book Collections*

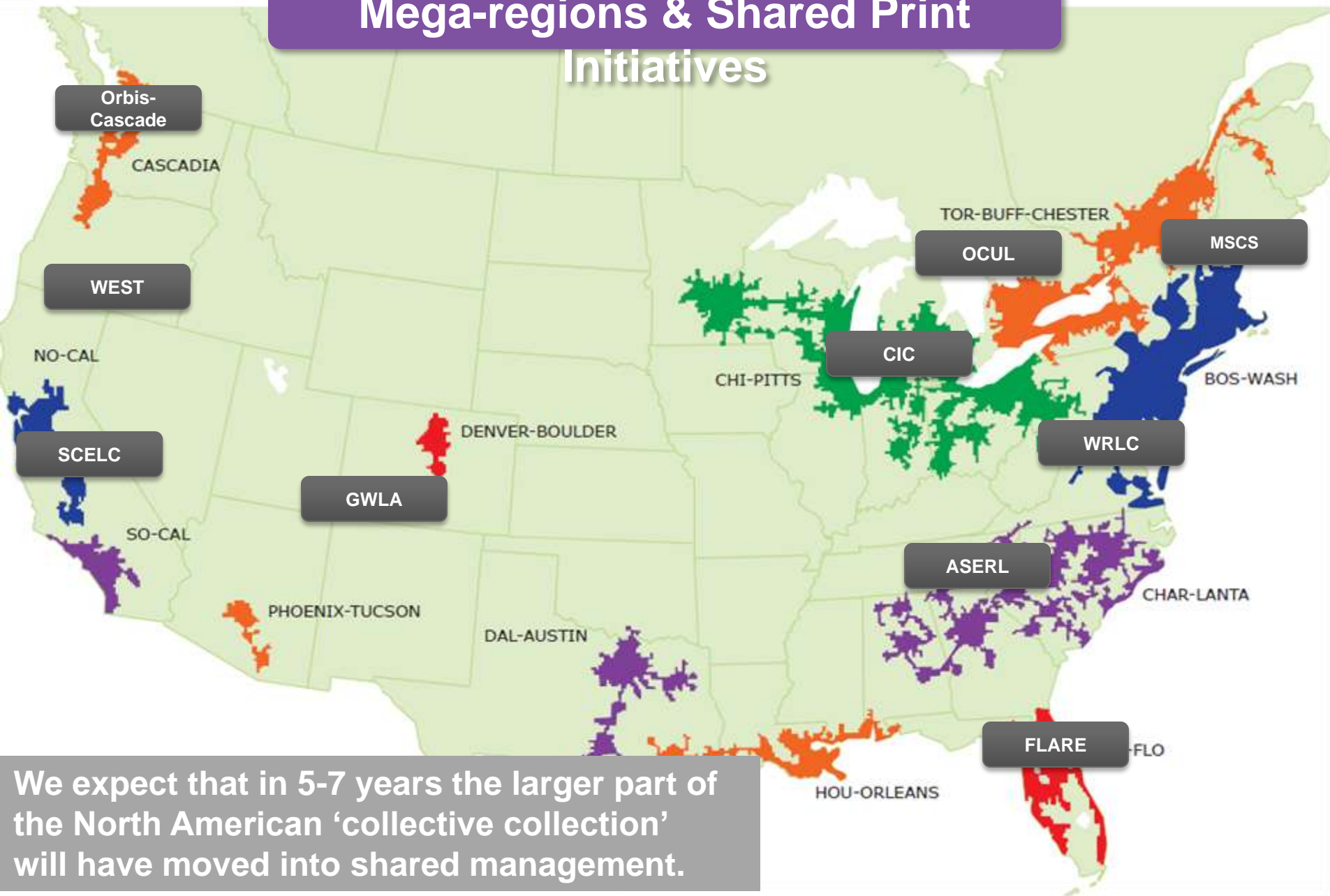

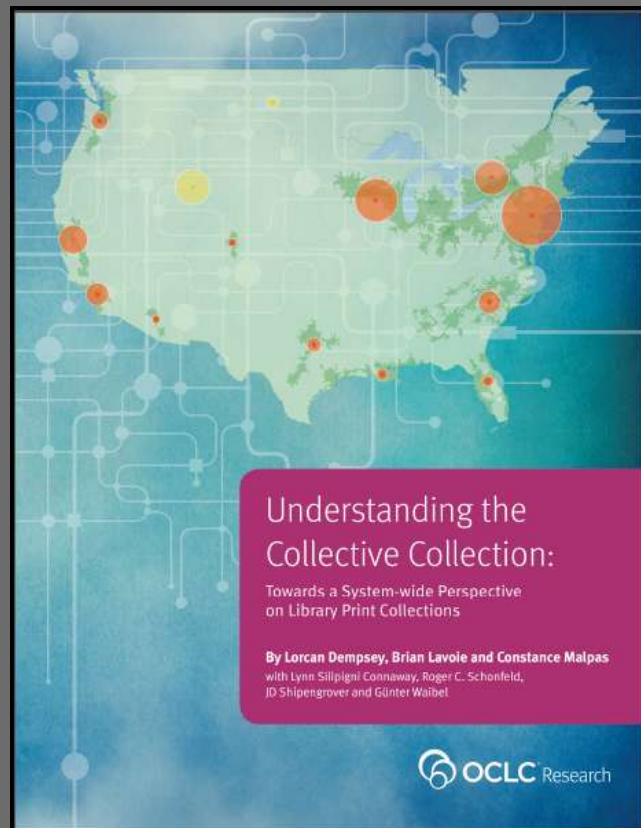
