Why Shared Print?

- Reclamation/transformation of valuable library space
- Shift from “commodity” print materials to “gathering and curating” rare and unique documents
- Increasing print-to-electronic transition
- Prospective collection management
- Mitigation of inventory expenses



Goals for OCLC to Support Members

- Support the management of the collective collection
- Make the shared print workflow less labor-intensive
- Use data to support & supplement the expertise of librarians & faculty
- Establish WorldCat as the locus for shared print activities
 - Usage and Overlap Analysis
 - Registration of Retention Commitments
 - Display and Query

Assistance with Requirements

Registration Benefits

- A streamlined registration process that:
 - Allows batch creation of Shared Print monograph retention commitments
 - Uses non-MARC data to create LHRs (via 583 Action Note)
 - Eliminates the need for an OCLC second symbol
 - Sets the Shared Print holding type flag in the WorldCat bib record which enables visibility into Display and Query
 - Provides ability to output MARC records in multiple formats, including non-interleaved LHRs, for input into ILS

Registration Process – Overview

- How does it work? Simple 2-step process:
- Batch loading of bibliographic items that a library has committed to retain
- Completion of a brief online template that specifies the contents of the 583 Action Note which details the terms of the retention commitment

Display & Query Progress

- Currently developing high-level requirements for Display and Query phase
- Receiving feedback from members
 - EAST Consortium Advisory Group
 - Pilot Consortia (CI-CCI and WRLC)
 - Focus Groups at major librarian conferences
