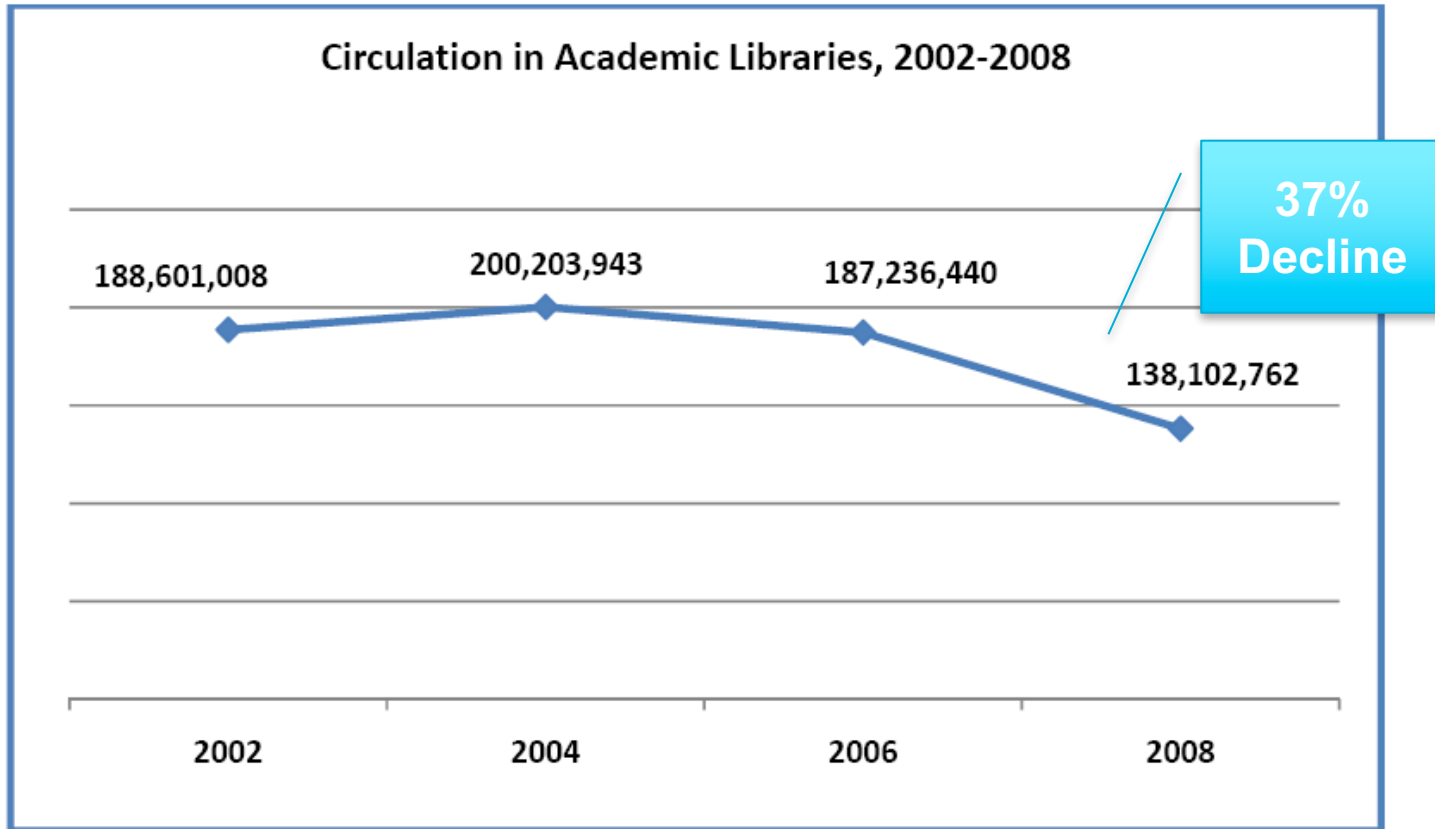
Issues facing local print book collections

- Stacks are overcrowded
- Use of print books is low and declining
- Library space is wanted for other purposes
- Print redundancy is significant
- The cost of keeping books on shelves is high
- Alternatives exists, but the data is scattered
- Traditional approaches to deselection are costly and time-consuming
- Where do print book collections fit in the library's priorities?

1. Introduction

Among the critical functions of research and academic libraries is preservation—keeping both the scholarly record and much of the associated cultural record fit for use over time. Until recently, maintaining this record entailed managing primarily printed works, of ink on paper, bound in book form. The advent of electronic texts poses a novel and expensive set of preservation problems for academic libraries that have been addressed by many current and recent studies on the cost of digital preservation.¹ The topic of this report is the cost of storing and using print in old-fashioned codex form.²

We have two motivations for doing this work. The first is something of a straw man: as librarians and their funders become increasingly aware of the daunting technical and economic problems associated with digital preservation, there is often a certain wistfulness for

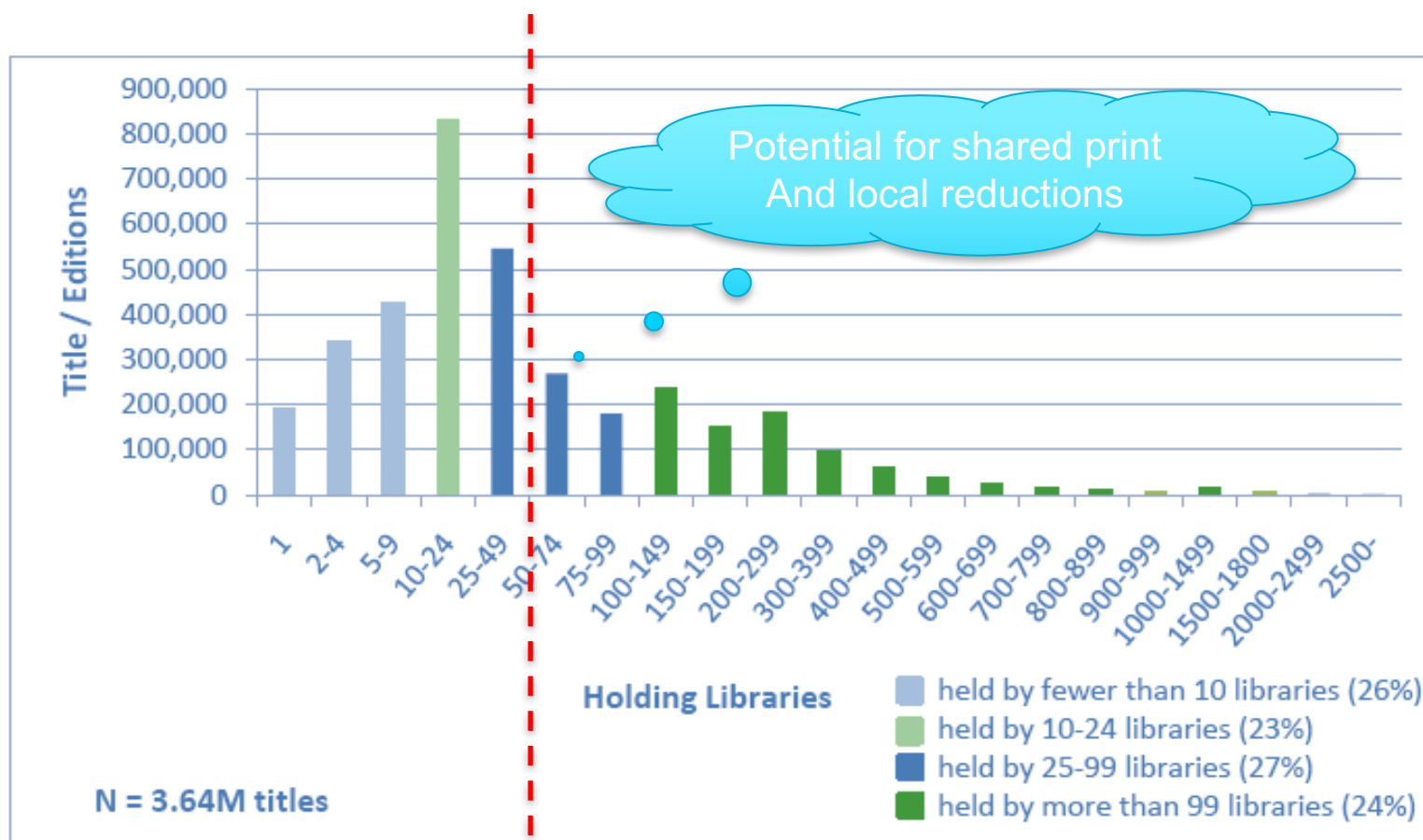


Figure 8. System-wide distribution of library holdings for titles in HathiTrust Digital Library (June 2010)

Thanks to the hard work of the EAST team and our vendor partner, [OCLC Sustainable Collection Services \(SCS\)](#), we have just completed finalizing allocations of some 6.2 Million [retention commitments](#) to the 40 EAST [Retention Partners](#). This represents some 36% of the total EAST collective collection of over 16 Million

holdings. Over the next month, the Retention Partners will review their allocation proposals and finalize them with SCS which will reload them into the online application, [GreenGlass™](#). In parallel EAST is working to finalize documentation and processing for disclosure of these retention commitments. **Stay tuned**

Shared Print: Retention First!

- Establish a safety net: ensure that all titles are secure
- Group-wide agreement on retention models
- Group-wide commitment to retention rules & duration
- Secure scarcely-held titles within the group
- Secure sufficient holdings of each titles to satisfy likely user demand
- Share responsibility for retention proportionately
- Deselection ***only*** after retention commitments established

OCLC Shared Print

- Support **‘above the institution’** collection management
- Make the shared print workflow **less labor-intensive**
- **Use data** to support and supplement the expertise of librarians and faculty

- How rare are my rare books?

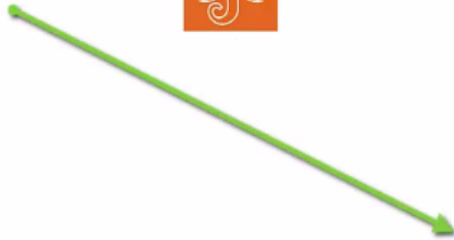

WorldCat Matching

- Same Edition: Holding set on **same** OCLC#
 - Better for widely-held, conservative for deselection
- Any Edition: Holding set on ***same or related*** OCLC#
 - defined by OCLC Work Family
 - Links new, revised, US/UK, reprint, large print editions
 - Better for scarcely held, minimizes false uniqueness
- OCLC Work ID#

What Is GreenGlass?

GreenGlass is a web-based application built by SCS.

GreenGlass provides intelligent and efficient support for decisions about **adjusting or reducing your print book collection**.

GreenGlass gathers **deselection metadata** (usage, holdings in other libraries, secure digital versions, authoritative title lists) and **enables librarians to develop criteria and lists** for withdrawal or retention.

From Data to Decision Support

- Assemble usage and overlap data
- Support library-defined rules that operate against that data
- Coordinate retention scenarios across all institutions (in a group setting)
- Facilitate retention, storage or withdrawal decisions in local collections
- Incorporate 'archival' values and 'service' values into deselection decisions

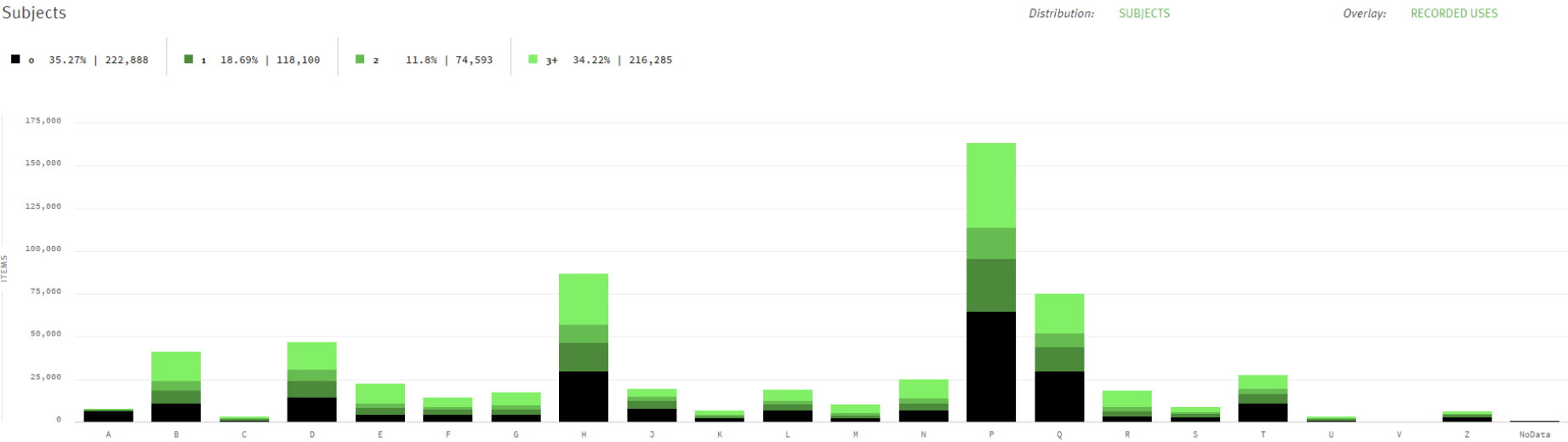

Key Metrics

SCS has been delivering a set of Key Metrics to every client library since the launch of GreenGlass in 2012. For each measure, we offer a green hyperlink to the corresponding list of items, and a calculated percentage of your overall collection. The accumulation of these measures provides an interesting opportunity for you to compare your own key measures with most of the other libraries with which we have worked. These numbers are based on nearly 200 US academic libraries, and 70 million holdings. They include research libraries, state universities, 4-year colleges, and a handful of community colleges.

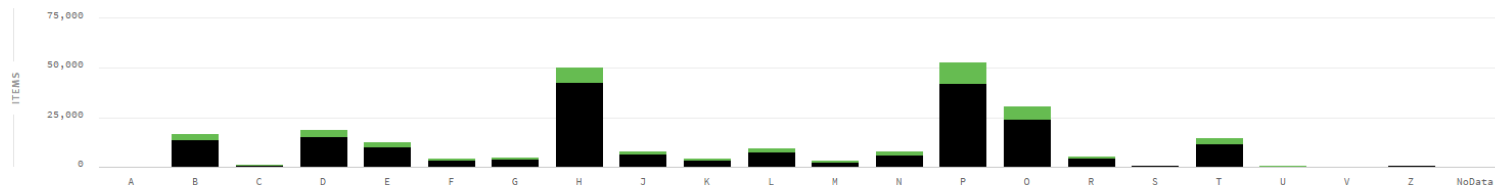

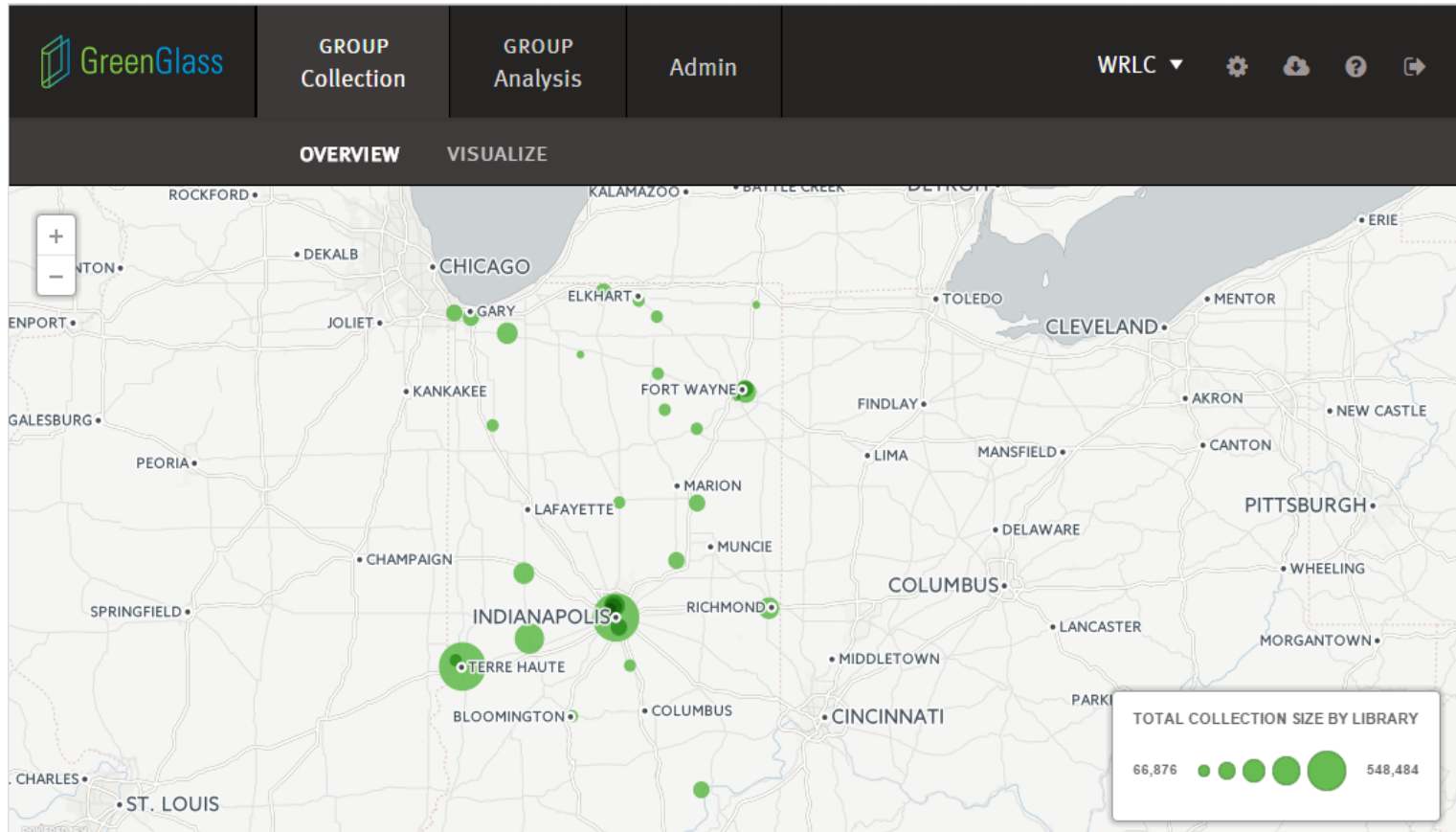

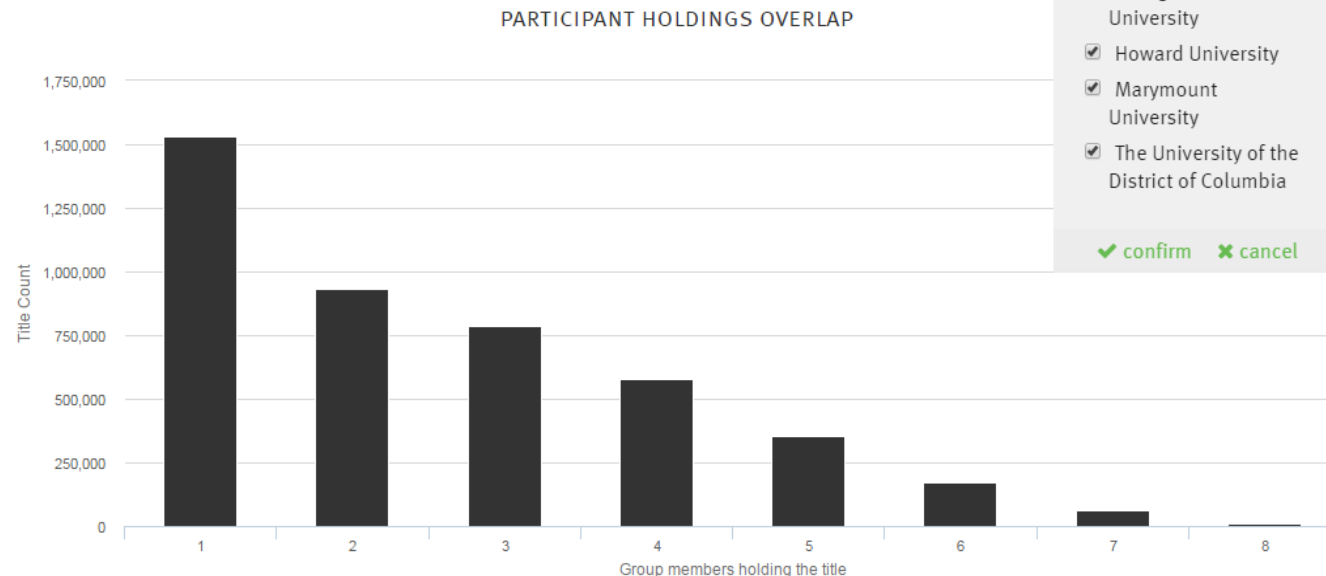

When creating group models for retention the **overlap** attribute can be a helpful tool in identifying potentially redundant within the collection as a whole. When reviewed with total recorded uses, year published and start to see usage patterns in your collection that may be underutilized, no longer utilized, or are of a more recent vintage.

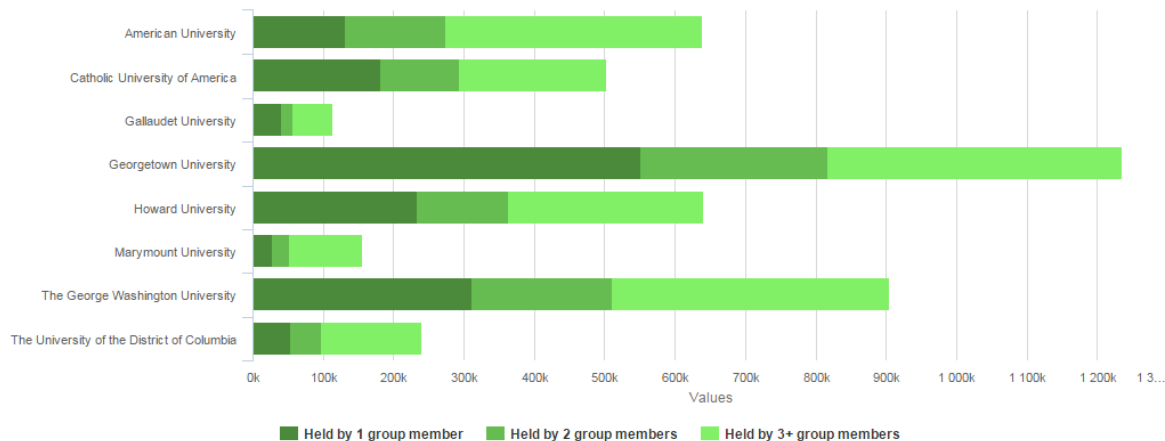

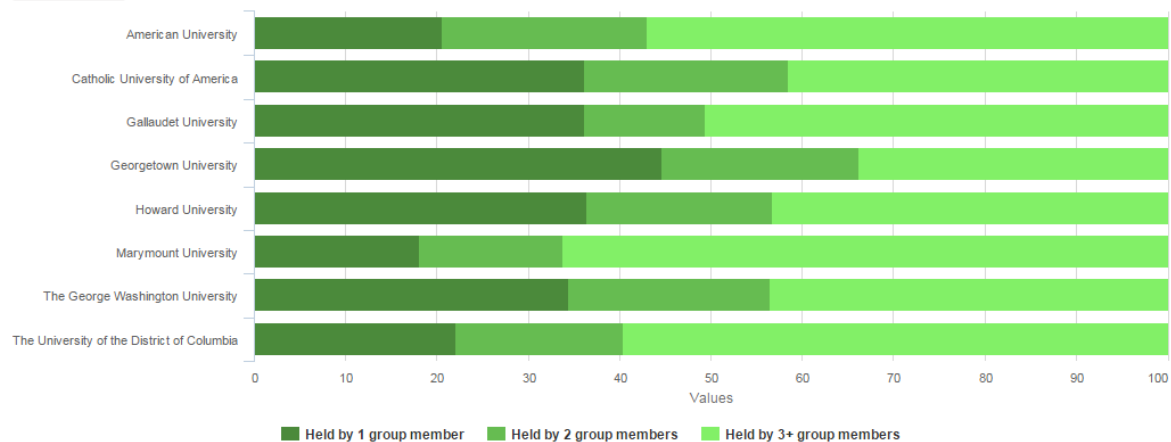

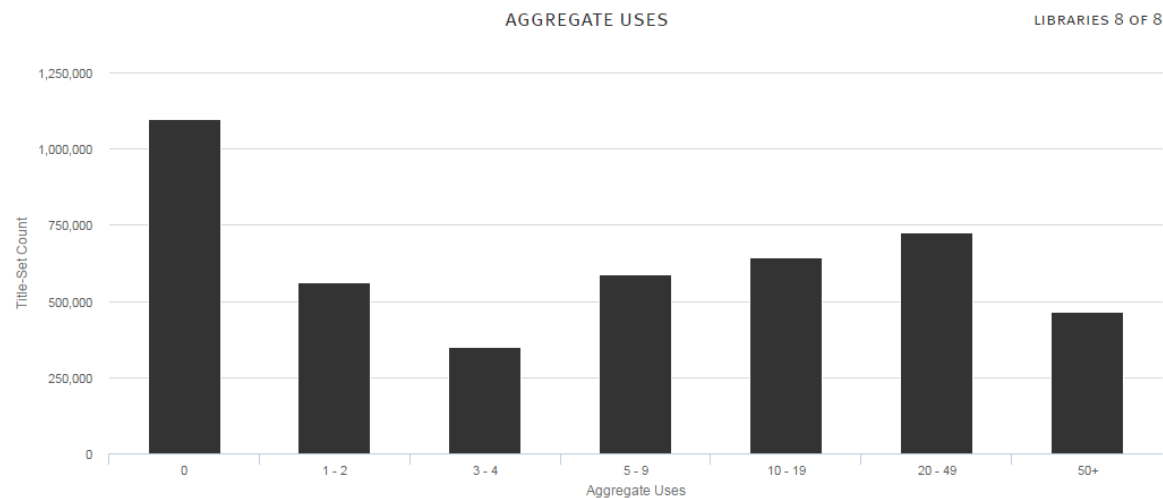

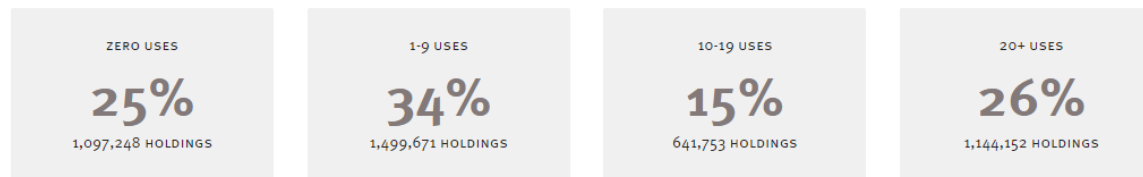


Title-Set Attribute: Aggregate Uses

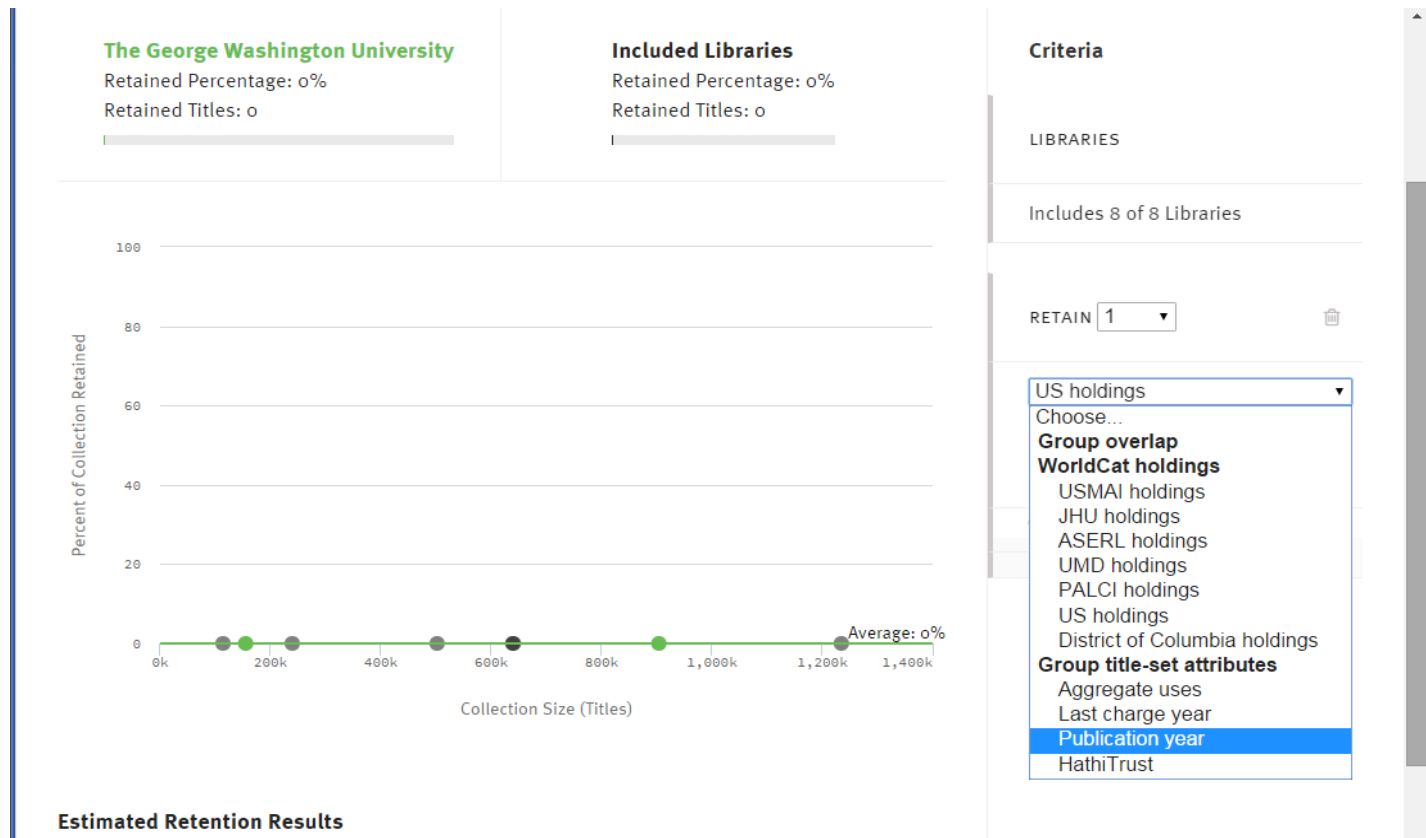


Title count grouped by aggregated uses — Aggregated uses is the sum of all recorded uses in the 8 (of 8) libraries in this selected group. Taller bars mean more titles have that many uses. Hover over each bar to see the exact number of titles.

Aggregate Uses is the metric used to assess usage at the group level. Aggregate uses combines all the recorded uses for a given title, from all the libraries that hold it. In this chart, the bar on the far left represents the number of titles what have no recorded uses, anywhere in the group. The next bar to the right represents titles with a single use and so on. The bar on the far right, represents titles with a significant number of aggregate uses.
