Definitions for the Visitors and Residents Mapping Exercise

Visitor: functional use of technology, often linked to formal need (such as use of software for specific coursework, or organising meetings through email contact); less visible/more passive online presence, more likely to favor face-to-face interactions (even as they use the internet to organize/schedule those interactions)

Resident: significant online presence and usage; high level of collaborative activity online; contributions to the online environment in the form of uploading materials, photos, videos.

Context is important

We often behave differently when we are using the Internet in a **Personal** context versus an **Institutional** (work-related) context and sometimes we use it the same. For example, *Facebook* may be where you hang out with your friends online and you are a **Resident** because you leave lots of social traces as you interact with everyone. When you use *Google* to search, you do it as a **Visitor**. A search engine is a tool that you use to search for things, and when you use it you don't want to leave traces behind. You use it at home (**Personal**), at work (**Institutional**), and everywhere in between. But no matter where you are, you always use a search engine as a **Visitor**.
