

A staff experience that offers buy, as well as borrow and facilitates borrowing and lending of licensed and digital content







Going Green! Summer 2009





Initiative: Going Green/Saving Resources



- New Categories for Users
 - SHIPPED
 - RECEIVED
- Items would stay in these categories for the life of the request, no need to maintain paper copy of the request

Initiative: Going Green/Saving Resources



Tracking

- UPS, DHL, FedEx, USPS
- Implement APIs in WCRS, web services, VDX (not all at the same time)
- Re-implement "WILL SUPPLY" category
- With barcode reader to enter tracking number in and move to SHIPPED

Initiative: Buy It / Document Supplier



Deflection

 Based on local holdings, the lender that has up-to-date local holdings can elect to not receive requests for which they do not hold the item

Reasons for no: Deflection

 Lenders want the ability to set what the reason for no is in the case that multiple reasons apply, for a specific policy

Initiative: Buy It / Document Supplier



Auto-trigger RECEIVED after XX days

- This would be a solution for IFM on SHIPPED/UNDO SHIPPED/NOT RECEIVED
- This would help our lenders receive IFM payment accurately, not forcing libraries to invoice one another

OCLC ILLiad Update



- New Milestones
- Version 7.3
- OCLC ILLiad Hosting Service
- Version 8.0

New Milestones



- Over 1000 ILLiad libraries!
 - 100+ new ILLiad libraries added during the past year
- 302 OCLC hosted ILLiad sites!
 - 234 of which are on current version

ILLiad 7.3



- Overhauled Web reports new graphs and layouts
 - Better performance and more customization
- Odyssey Helper added to help streamline Lending and Doc Del Odyssey deliveries
- Web Circ module this web-based access module allows limited access to ILLiad for circulation staff to help check materials in and out of ILLiad

ILLiad 7.3 (cont.)



- ILLiad System Manager service combines ILLiad
 Cleanup and Email Manager services
- Rapid Manager a new Web service for handling Rapid requests in the ILLiad client
 - Additional functionality will be in v.7.3.1
- In preparation of ILLiad v.8.0, the Customization Manager uses a new ribbon-based interface and .NET to connect to the SQL database

OCLC ILLiad Hosting Service



- 302 OCLC hosted ILLiad sites
 - 234 of which are on current version
- Over 50% of new orders are for the OCLC hosted option
- Self-hosted to OCLC hosted migrations
 - Ongoing: Harvard Univ., Ohio State Univ., Kutztown Univ.

OCLC ILLiad Hosting Service (cont.)



- Provides ILLiad server software, Web Server and a SQL Database Server
- Monitoring service notifies OCLC operations when ILLiad or Web services are inoperative anytime 24/7
- Online scheduling of upgrades

OCLC ILLiad Hosting Service (cont.)



- Anti-virus software
- Dedicated network firewall
- Backups include:
 - Hourly ILLiad SQL Database
 - Nightly SQL Database, Web pages & PDF files
 - Weekly archived and sent to offsite storage

OCLC ILLiad Hosting Service (cont.)



- "OCLC can quickly fix solve some problems for us instead of giving us directions on how to solve it for ourselves" - PA
- "We are a medium size library and a hosted site and I can't imagine any cons." - FL
- "OCLC hosts our ILLiad connection and I don't know what we would
 do without it. In addition to a fairly easy delivery method (ftp to
 the OCLC server), the customer support is outstanding. I doubt that
 we would receive the same support internally due to their
 unfamiliarity with ILLiad and many other concerns. " NY

ILLiad 8.0 (and beyond)



- Complete re-write of all software from Delphi programming language to C#
- Ribbon-based interface for all ILLiad client components
- Will also use .NET to connect to the SQL database
- the .NET communication model removes the BDE (Borland Database Engine) component requirement and should increase client/server communication performance
- Expected around the end of 2008; demos at ALA Midwinter

Phase 1 - lending library to user

Phase 2 - pilot with commercial supplier

Home Delivery Pilot Overview



Components

- Funding for equipment and postage by OCLC
- Facilitate equipment and packaging materials for home delivery (and return) of materials
- Survey patrons and librarians on use and value

Pilot Goals



OCLC

- Determine level of patron interest in home delivery
- Define logistics of home delivery
- Test NCIP for patron authentication and workflow savings

Montana

- Central NCIP authentication works smoothly and seamlessly for user
- Home delivery option becomes viable
- Courier possibilities are discovered as part of the process
- Montana statewide library card gains local and statewide support

Patron feedback



I love this! I hope it will become a feature of our library.

It's wonderful. It allows me to utilize the library's service with much more convenience as I live far away from the library.

Service was quick and convenient. It was exciting to get, felt like Christmas!

Cool, to just order online and have it delivered home

Pilot experiences: Successes



Patrons love the home delivery option

- Overwhelmingly positive about home delivery
- Over 90% willing to recommend service to others
- 60% of users are willing to pay
 - \$5 range, per delivery or item
- Over 70% said they chose home delivery for convenience
 Patrons from non-pilot communities interested in service
 Less work for library staff (when NCIP worked as planned)

Montana staff experiences



This is a great service! We would love to continue providing the service to our patrons, but because of budget constraints we will not be able to continue this service.

The whole idea and "mission" of the program is great. We all learned a lot by participating in this pilot program and tried to keep that in mind throughout the program. Patrons loved it and even those who may not have tried it - talked as if they saw the merit in the service. It is a great service for those who can afford to offer it. Patrons loved it!

OCLC Future plans/Home Delivery



Over the next year

- Tracking for major carriers
- Home delivery in existing products
 - WCRS/ILLiad, VDX, WorldCat Navigator
 - Home delivery as option to own patrons via OCLC ILS products
 - Built around returning materials to home library for return to lender

In the next 2+ years

- End user payment put in place
- Negotiations between OCLC and major carriers for shipping discounts for OCLC members

WorldCat Direct Phase 2 Pilot



Same purpose: Home delivery for ILL Request

Differences:

- Resources provided by book supplier instead of lending library
- Patron may purchase book
- Patron may keep book longer
- Borrowing library pays for each delivery

WorldCat Direct Pilot



• Goals:

- 1. Reduce costs by eliminating wasteful steps in library supply chain
- 2.Get ILL requests to patrons faster
- 3.Add more value to WorldCat Resource Sharing community by offering alternatives to traditional ILL

Progress So Far - limited to US libraries



- 11 Pilot Participants
- Columbus Metropolitan Library, Ohio May
- High Plains Library District, Colorado May
- Westerville Public Library, Ohio June
- Lincoln Trail Libraries District, Illinois: September
 - Des Plaines Public Library
 - Champaign Public Library
 - Edwardsville Public Library
 - University of Illinois @ Chicago
 - University of Illinois @ Springfield
 - Lewis & Clark Library System
 - Lincoln Library
 - Hoopeston Public Library

Non-Pilot Library Use



- Better World Books must have an interesting inventory...
 - >950 requests from non-pilot libraries through WorldCat Resource Sharing
 - Not-pilot libraries receive many of the same benefits as pilot libraries, except there is no home delivery - libraries still have to receive request and process like any other ILL
 - 30 day loans
 - Postage paid return envelope
 - Ability to purchase book

Progress So Far



- VERY PRELIMINARY USER SURVEY RESULTS...
- 4 months into the pilot
 - 91% of users agreed, or completely agreed with the statement, "Overall, I was satisfied with the home delivery service." (77% completely agreed)
 - 84% plan to use the service again
 - 87% would recommend the service to others
 - 5% purchased the book
 - 92% very satisfied with option to purchase book
