Our Approach

- 1. Interviews
 - 10 experts (reference librarians)
 - 36 end-users (24 undergraduates+12 master's)
- 2. Content analysis (qualitative)
 - 500 questions from Yahoo! Answers
 - 500 questions from WikiAnswers
- 3. Content analysis (quantitative)

Yahoo! Answers:

Questions: 3 million+

Answers: 16 million+

Avg. answers per question: ~6

Users: 1 million+



Deriving Aspects of Quality, Relevance & Satisfaction

- Cognitive aspects
- Social aspects
 - Situational
 - Affective
 - Organizational/collaborative

Finding #1: Physical vs. Virtual Interactions

- More important for VR: effectiveness, timeliness, and accessibility/convenience
- Affective aspects ranked higher for face-to-face interactions
- Teaching effective search strategies better conveyed over VR

Finding #2: Perception of Physical & Virtual Reference

- Reference desk underutilized, often confused with circulation
- Use of VR more popular among undergraduates than master's students
- Students more likely to use (and reuse) reference services if expected by their instructors

Finding #3: Access and Question Type

- Most common pattern for online Q&A:
 - Google -> Type question -> Visit SQA site
- Trust is a huge factor in using/choosing a source
- WikiAnswers more popular with fact finding questions
- Yahoo! Answers more popular with opinion/advice questions





Summary

- Information seeking behavior of a typical user has changed and is changing significantly.
- Expectations question instead of keywords, customized answers, social and collaborative support, natural interfaces (e.g., Siri on iPhone).
- Need a fundamental shift (not another brick in the wall) for reference services. We need to be where "the puck is going to be".

Ongoing/Future Work


- Explore the feasibility of linking VR and SQA services as a part of IMLS-funded Cyber Synergy project
- Study how information seekers value/assess information provided in online Q&A services
- Build a comprehensive model to explain (and predict) content quality in both VR and SQA
- Use the wisdom of the "wise" crowd
