## Contributed to OCLC Services Development

OCLC Crosswalk Service – metadata translation approach originated and original code developed by OCLC Research; significant ongoing support for service that is critical to OCLC's ability to make metadata handling from many sources web scale in scope and volume.

OCLC Developers Network [pdf] – Programs and Research staff were instrumental in helping to organize and launch this new initiative, in which a community of developers collaborate in a "sandbox" environment in order to purpose, discuss and test WorldCat Grid Services.

 One output from this was the January launch of WorldCat API, a pilot system for searching WorldCat bibliographic data that is now available to more than a dozen institutions. It is scheduled to be made generally available as a production system in August 2008.

Registry of Copyright Evidence – Programs and Research staff and RLG Partner institutions contributed time and expertise to initial design and data work to support development of this new service which builds on OCLC's commitment to registries as a basis for effective Web services.

WorldCat & WorldCat Local – Programs and Research staff contributed significant time and expertise to <u>usability testing</u> and helping product staff plan new features for the popular WorldCat Local service.

<u>WorldCat-CBS</u> synchronization – Programs and Research staff were instrumental in the successful installation of new software that uses SRU update to synchronize the Dutch Union catalog with WorldCat.

<u>WorldCat Identities</u> – Programs and Research staff helped release a production version as part of enhancement to <u>WorldCat.org</u> (see Lorcan Dempsey's blog entry for more information).
